U.S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, July 6 — (AP) — Even though the steel strike has lasted five weeks, most steel users have been able to operate without difficulty.

The magazine Steel, reporting this today, said they all have been living off their inventories but the inventories are about depleted now. However, Steel pointed out that mass vacations are starting in many of these metal-working plants.

The trouble will come when work resumes in the mills, it said, because it will take 10 days to two weeks to get the flow back to steel consumers.

Steel made no comment on when it thought the strike would end. Last week Steel said many executives in the industry thought it would be over by today.

Most difficult items to buy now are steel bars and plates, said Steel.

Reign of Terror Reports Said Exaggerated

By Norman MacSwan TOKYO, July 5 — (Reuters) — A Japanese Foreign Office official today described press reports of a "reign of terror" by Commonwealth soldiers in Japan as greatly exaggerated. Conditions are not as bad as people have been led to believe, said Yujiro Izeki, director of the Foreign Office's international cooperation bureau, at a press conference after he returned from Kure.

"Certainly crime in Kure is no worse than in towns where American troops are stationed," he added.

Japanese newspapers have accused Canadian, British and Australian troops of crimes including rape, assault and burglary at the former naval base of Kure on the south coast of Japan's main island.

Izeki said most of the crimes committed at Kure were of a petty nature such as "soldiers under the influence of alcohol breaking window panes."

Reports that Kure and the surrounding district are riddled with sex crimes by foreign soldiers are not true, he declared.

Notes Feeling Of Optimism In The Maritimes

MONCTON, N. B., July 5 — "A feeling of optimism seems to pervade the Maritime Provinces which is based upon solid grounds judging by my observations after visiting the principal centres in those provinces, including Halifax, Sydney, Saint John, Fredericton, Charlottetown and Moncton, declared J. A. Argo, assistant vice-president of traffic for the Canadian National Railways on his return to Montreal today following a tour of these provinces, accompanied by H. C. Champ, traffic manager for the Atlantic Region of the railway.

"Business in all lines seems to be holding its own with the possible exception of forest products, which appears to be experiencing a slight setback but this will probably right itself as the season advances and the international situation clears," Mr. Argo continued. "I find considerable construction activity going on, with the building of new industries and extension of existing manufacturing establishments."

"Another feature in the industrial sphere that seemed to me apparent was the resurgence of the pioneer spirit that made these provinces an important factor in the industrial and economic life of Canada," Mr. Argo said, "everywhere I went the same spirit seemed to predominate which augurs well for the future of this part of Canada," he concluded.

Canada's Steel Output Increases

OTTAWA, July 5 — (CP) — Canada's steel mills, pressed on all sides for increased production, turned out 1,551,738 tons in the first five months of the year, a first five months total of 1,479,605 in the same period last year, the Bureau of Statistics reported today.

Production during May increased to 318,890 tons, a gain from 302,928 during May, 1951. Daily average production in May was 10,287 tons, compared with 9,772 last year.
