

Student Spies For RCMP

HALIFAX (CUP) -- The RCMP hired a Dalhousie student last year to infiltrate and spy on a political group, the Dalhousie Gazette has learned. The student whose name has been withheld, collected personal information about In Struggle, a Marxist-Leninist organization in return for up to \$125 a month from October 1979 to February 1980. A statement released by

In Struggle, and confirmed by other sources, reveals the individual's description of his involvement with the RCMP. He had trouble with the RCMP three years ago over drug problems. The RCMP contacted him again last year offering him a job to go to Dalhousie. According to the statement, the infiltrator "was instructed to gather information on In Struggle, the people

who were its supporters.. and where (the members), lived and worked.

He was encouraged to make friends in the group, with the hope of being defended

if he was suspected of being an informer. The student terminated his RCMP affiliation because his conscience bothered him.

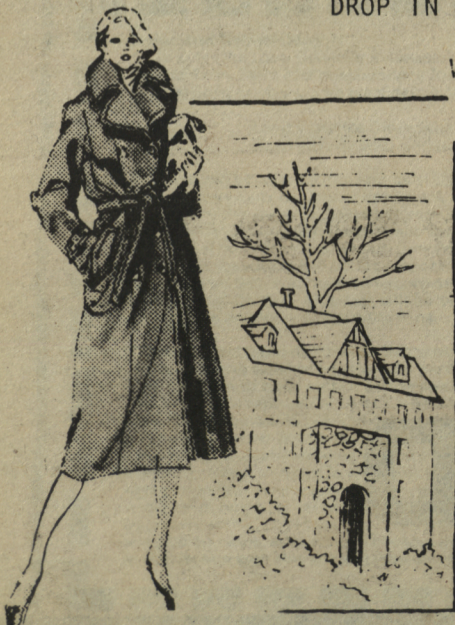
