TIPS ON GOLFING

Knee Action In Backswing

The popular treatments of golf faults are like the burlesque comic's stunt of wearing nothing but a high hat and his underwear. By acting as though properly dressed he becomes ridiculous and funny to his audiences.

Golfers, both players and teachers, follow a procedure that is just as ridiculous, but not as funny.

This procedure covers their usual ways of dealing with swing faults. By trying to completely isolate single faults they are hoping to make everything all right by putting on a high hat. One of the best examples is the effort to improve hand positions or movements without proper consideration for the ever present influence of body movements on the hands.

Recently a player came to me complaining about the action of his hands when playing short shots. His hands didn't feel alive during his swing and they didn't give him the necessary control over his club. Owing to this, he figured, he never knew how he would hit the

NEW YORK (AP) — Outfielder Gene Woodling of the Cleveland Indians is going to undergo a medical examination in a clinic in New Jersey, his home state. He has been suffering from dizzy spells and occasional listlessness.

Woodling, who wasn't able to leave with his teammates for Cleveland Thursday night, because of the examination, was reluctant to discuss the matter.

"After the tests are over, I'll let you know," he told a reporter.

Manager Al Lopez, who has talked with Woodling's personal physician, said there appears to be no cause for alarm.

"But it's best to find out now what is causing the trouble," Lopez said.

TOSSES 7 INNING 3-HITTER

Bill Harris Hurls Royals To 3-2 Win Over Havana

MONTREAL (CP) — Montreal Royals Thursday combined stinging pitching and power at the plate to take an International League doubleheader from Havana Sugar Kings by scores of 10-0 and 3-2.

An ascension Thursday crowd of 6,009 saw southpaw Fred Kipp go the route for the Royals in the opener by scattering four hits and righthander Billy Harris take the seven-inning nightcap on three safeties.

It was Kipp's second win against two losses, while Harris brought his season mark to 2-1. Vincente Amor took his fourth loss in five starts for the Sugar Kings in the opener. Don Gross lost his only decision of the season in the second game.

Catcher John Roseboro paced

the Montreal attack in the opener with five RBI's on a tow-run homer, a double and a single.

Harris' lack of control often had him in trouble in the second game as he walked seven men—five of them in the first two innings but he settled down as the game progressed.

Havana leftfielder Ullus Alvarez caused Harris the most trouble as he drove in both runs with a single and a booming double against the left field wall.

The Sugar Kings went ahead in the first inning but Montreal equalized on an unearned run in the

third when they took advantage of two errors and a stolen base. George Shuba added another run in the fourth on his bases-empty homer over the right-centre field wall.

Montreal pushed across the winning run in the sixth on two singles, a sacrifice and a base on balls.

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Dow Finsterwald, a "Johnny come lately" in pro golf circles, turned on a full head of steam Thursday with a blistering seven-under-par 65 to take the first-day lead in the 25,000 St. Louis open.

The 26-year-old Bedford Heights, Ohio, professional of only four years rammed in nine birdies and seven pars on the 6,277-yard course.

Jack Burke, Jr., masters champion from Kiamesha Lake, N.Y., held down second spot in the fight for \$5,000 first prize money, just two strokes behind at 67.

Seven others came in with 69s to stay within reach of Finsterwald. They included Stan Leonard of Lachute, Que.
