## Says Cost of G. M. Cars is Ahead of Price

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Harlow Curtice of General Motors testified Thursday that the cost of his company's cars has increased faster than the price it charges for them.

Curtice appeared before the Senate anti-trust and monopoly subcommittee in its study of the automobile industry's pricing practices.

Some of Thursday's questioning went off at a tangent from the main subject, with these results:

1. Curtice said General Motors has been studying for years whether to build a small car to compete with imported cars but "thus far it has not been practical from the standpoint of economics."

2. The GM chief said his corporation continues to take the position that ability of a company to pay higher wages is not a collective bargaining issue.

Curtice said that higher prices on 1958 GM models failed to cover the increased cost of making them, and "for every dollar of increase in our own costs, price has increased only 60 cents."
