

IN MEMORIAM

JOHN J. CALLAGHAN

The residents of Lake Verde and vicinity, were deeply saddened on February 9th, 1952, when it became known that John J. Callaghan, had passed away at the Charlottetown Hospital, a victim of that dread disease, cancer.

Born at Lake Verde, May 14th, 1889, the eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Callaghan, he engaged in farming until the outbreak of the first World War.

He was frequently visited during his last illness by his pastor, Rev. Urban Gillis, also by his former pastor, Messrs. Maurice MacDonald, who administered to him the last rites of the Roman Catholic Church of which he was always a devout member.

Besides his wife (nee Margaret MacKenzie) he leaves to mourn three daughters and two sons, namely: Mrs. Leo Callaghan, Charlotte; Tena and Annie, Charlotte; Allan, Toronto, Ontario, and Kenneth, Lake Verde; also one sister and five brothers; Anne, Fairfield, Maine; Ambrose, New York; James, Chestnut Hill, Mass.; Augustine, Fairfield, Maine; Owen and Louis, Lake Verde.

His funeral under the direction of M. E. Jenkins, to St. Joachim's Church, Vernon River, on Tuesday, February 12th, was largely attended, notwithstanding the inclemency of the weather. Requiem High Mass was celebrated by the pastor Rev. Urban Gillis, who also performed the services at the grave, where all that was mortal of a kind husband and loving father was laid to rest.
