## Lion Appears Recovering From Surgery On Hind Legs

MONTREAL (CP)—Cato, a two-year-old male lion who underwent a unique spinal operation, appears on the road to recovery.

The doctors also took an electrocardiogram, a measurement of the heart action, which they believed is the first ever taken of a lion.

The operation was performed on two tables drawn together in a special building used for animal experiments to advance human medicine.

"We treated the lion exactly like we would treat a man in the same situation," said Dr. Allan Wigger, a post-graduate student on staff from Winston-Salem, N.C.

He said the medical team performed the job without fee.

Cato's condition developed about six months ago. In recent weeks, he showed progressive paralysis.

Montreal veterinarians who examined the lion suggested the only hope was a neurological consultation.

Aerts then sought out Dr. Hardy who agreed to see the animal. An arrangement was made later to bring Cato to hospital this week.

**LOYOLA FROM MERGER**

MONTREAL (CP)—Loyola will be the name of Quebec's next English-Catholic university formed by the merger of Loyola College, Marianopolis College for girls, St. Joseph's Teachers College and the Thomas More Institute for adult education. Two of the institutions had disputed the name now decided upon.

The operation was finished at 4 a.m. Tuesday, eight hours after Cato was brought into the animal laboratory of Notre Dame Hospital. The actual surgery took only about one hour.

Cato's ailment was described as a "classic case of paraplegia," or hind leg paralysis.

**GIVEN SLEEPING PILL**

Cato, valued at \$10,000 by his owner, was brought to the hospital's goods entrance in a cage. He was given a sleeping pill, then anesthesia by Dr. Jacques Boucher so that a special x-ray examination could be carried out by Dr. Jean-Louis Leger, the hospital's chief radiologist.

The examination is called a myelogram, a procedure which calls for positioning the patient head up, and injecting an opaque substance into the spinal column. In Cato, the x-ray

showed the substance stopped just below the chest, the point of a block, and the spot to operate.

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## Kosygin Plans Early Visit To North Viet Nam

MOSCOW (Reuters)—The announcement of a visit soon by Russian Premier Alexei Kosygin to Communist North Viet Nam suggests a new warmth in relations between the Kremlin and Peking's Indochina ally.

The announcement said Kosygin will in the near future head a seven-man delegation, including top experts on military aid, aviation fuel, inter-party relations, to Hanoi at the invitation of the North Vietnamese government.

Apart from Kosygin, only one leading Soviet Communist party figure was included, and the membership of the delegation gave rise to belief the most important topics for discussion will be Russian assistance to North Viet Nam's air force.

But the presence of Yuri Andropov, a party secretary responsible for relations with other parties, suggested the Russians might try to persuade their hosts to attend a meeting of Communist parties scheduled to take place here March 1.
