Finances of London Times Reorganized To Ensure Stability

LONDON (Reuters) — Proposals for reorganizing the capital structure of The Times, London's oldest daily newspaper, to "ensure maintenance of independence and stability" were announced by the newspaper Saturday. The financial reorganization, which involves issue of new shares in The Times Publishing Company and the abolition of a special controlling concern, The Times Holding Company, will "in no way" disturb the existing editorial direction of The Times by Col. J. J. Astor and John Walter, the announcement said.

Doesn't Want Pay For Second Attempt

VICTORIA (CP) — Swimmer Florence Chadwick says she doesn't want to be paid anything to make a second try at the strait of Juan de Fuca, a member of her team indicated Monday night.

The famed marathoner received \$10,000 from a paint company for her unsuccessful attempt Monday. The company threw in the \$2,500 it was to add to a guarantee of \$7,500 if she was successful. A swim official reported Miss Chadwick also earned an estimated gross of \$15,000 in television rights.
