ANOTHER "COUP."

PARIS, March 30. The Chamber of Deputies to-day, by a vote of 268 to 237, despite the opposition of the Government, voted for urgency for the extreme Left bill providing for a revision of the constitution.

NEW ZEALAND.

LONDON, March 30. A fierce storm, with high tides and tidal wave, which caused great damage in the north and south islands of New Zealand, have occurred.

TORONTO, March 30. The Convention at which delegates were present from the Baptist Church throughout the Dominion, concluded its sittings at Guelph at an early hour this morning.

A Charge Met by a Challenge.

TORONTO, March 30. Rev. Dr. Fulton, of Brooklyn, N. Y., who has been lecturing here the past few days, attacked the Romish convents, charging the priests with immorality, and that the nuns were kept in a condition of slavery.

Defaulters Captured.

TORONTO, March 30. Charles E. Cross, President, and Samuel C. White, Cashier, of the National Bank of Raleigh, North Carolina, who absconded two days ago, were arrested here to-night.

Punished.

MONTREAL, March 30. John Fahey, the convicted detective, was sentenced to fourteen years imprisonment in St. Vincent de Paul penitentiary, his counsel's application for appeal being refused.
