

STUDENT UNION BOOKSTORE

We all know that books cost a lot of money. But we still have to buy them, so the money has to go.

The UPEI Student Union offers you a chance to keep some of that money for other things you may need. During the 2nd semester, the Student Union will operate the **STUDENT UNION BOOKSTORE** in the Barn. Here's how it will work:

The bookstore will sell used books only. If you have a textbook or any other required material for a course, that you would like to sell, simply take it down to the Student Union Offices in the Barn anytime before January 11. (No term papers, exams, or incriminating pictures of professors suitable for blackmailing please). You will be asked, politely of course, to fill in the following receipt:

Notice that in this receipt, there is a spot for "price". The price is determined by you. Just fill in the price you want for the book, and if anybody is willing to pay it, then we'll sell it for you. If nobody is willing to buy your book for the price you are asking, though, we won't sell it and you lose! So keep it reasonable, please.

If, perchance, somebody is willing to pay the price you are asking, then

we'll sell the book and pass the money on to you. So be sure to check every day to see if your money is waiting for you.

Now for the other side of the coin. If you are looking for a good deal on a textbook, the S.U. bookstore may be your only hope of ever finding one. Our bookstore will be located in the Barn, and will be open from 11:00 am - 1:00 pm and only from Thursday, Jan. 5 - Thursday, Jan. 12. That is during the first week of classes only. If you see a book you want, open it, look at the condition of the book, and check the price. Then make a decision! If you want to buy the book, just pay your money to the pretty lady at the table and you'll find that **STUDENT UNION BOOKSTORE** you finally got a real bargain.

Please Note: That any books that are priced at \$3 or over will be levied a surcharge of 10% to help the Student Union pay the people who are working. Any books priced at under \$3 will be sold for the price quoted by the seller.

Please Note: That the Student Union will assume absolutely no responsibility for any books that are lost or stolen while in the bookstore. We'll have people to watch them, but they're still your responsibility. All we do is try to sell them.

Please Note: That the Student Union does not guarantee sale of all books. The book only gets sold if somebody is willing to pay the price that you, the owner, are asking. We will not haggle or make any deals. We sell the book only for the price the owner asks.

Please Note: It is the responsibility of the buyer to ensure that the book is reasonable condition, is readable, has no pages

missing, has no obscene little drawings on the inside, and does not have all the answers to the mid-term and final exams circled in green ink. We can't inspect every book that comes in, so please make sure that the book is in acceptable condition before you pay the bucks.

Please Note: That the bookstore is open for 2 hours per day only (11-1) and for the first week of classes only (Jan. 5-Jan. 12). Books for sale can be brought down to the Student Union Offices anytime before or after the Christmas break, but books will only be sold on the dates mentioned.

So, the Student Union bookstore is there to use if you want it. It seems like a pretty good way to make a couple of dollars

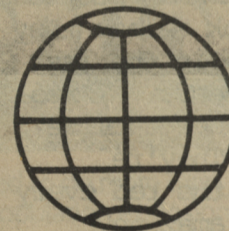

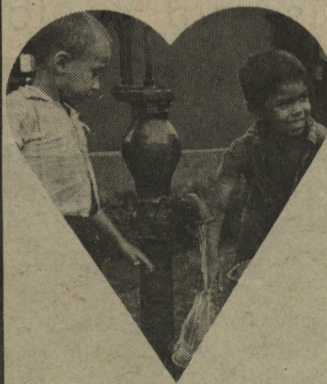
