

The Catholic Temperance Movement.

(From a Catholic American Paper.) Bishop Ireland in the course of his remarks spoke enthusiastically for total abstinence. He said:

The great Catholic nations of Europe were not at all addicted to intemperance. But in America many Catholics suffer in this direction, and the Catholic church suffered accordingly. It was a fact which could not be disguised that in the large cities Catholics furnish the largest proportion of criminals and paupers. What was the cause? It was intemperance. Take away the cause and the change would come at once.

Another fact: too many Catholics were engaged in the saloon business. Non-Catholic citizens pointed to this, and it lowered the church. These are facts which must be looked squarely in the face, and they should so educate their people that they will not drink or run saloons. Liquor sellers are doing the church more harm than any other source, and they should not be treated without eriging or fear. "Let us work so that very few Catholics will be found keeping saloons, and that those have so little patronage that they will be starved out and go into an honest business."

He had unbounded sympathy with the Union. Each member was a knight engaged in a holy war. The union was the hope of the church in America. He asked God's blessing on it, and hoped its members would go home with renewed inspiration. "Try," he said, "to get every Catholic to stop selling liquor. Do not handle a saloonkeeper tenderly, but hang to him until he is shown the error of his ways, and if necessary employ forcible means to that end."

Such fearless words from one high in the church had much weight with faithful Catholics. As we have remarked before, the curse of the Irish is intemperance, and the clergy have been too long silent on the subject.

Bishop Spaulding, who has for some time looked upon the movement favorably, came out boldly on the right side during the convention. His remarks were received with much favor.

A man should become a total abstainer not necessarily because he had been a drunkard, or had special reason to fear he might become one, but because he loved his fellow-man, his religion, his country; because he pitied the women who were the wives of brutal husbands, the mothers of helpless children and of drunken fathers, the maidens who were the victims of men to whom love meant only lust; because he felt that in the presence of the sin, the sorrow, the crime, and the degradation which hung like noisome reptiles around the wine-cup and spilled their uncleanness upon the fair name of Catholics and Americans, nothing was worthy of a true man but complete renunciation of the whole business.

These extracts will serve to give an idea of the spirit of the convention, and they show how firmly temperance principles are becoming rooted in the land. All temperance people regardless of creeds, will surely pay for a blessing on the work of the Catholic Total Abstinence Union.

DIRECTIONS TO VOTERS

At the Coming Scott Act Election in Charlottetown.

THE Scott Act is now in force in Charlottetown and will remain so until the majority of electors decide otherwise. For the purpose of discontinuing the Act in Charlottetown a petition was presented to the Governor-General praying that the Act should be repealed so far as this city is concerned. The present election is therefore held for the purpose of taking the votes of electors for and against this petition.

The voting will be by ballot, and the following is the form to be used, viz:

OCTOBER 16, 1884.

Voting on the petition to the Governor-General for the revocation of the order in Council bringing into force of the second part of "The Canada Temperance Act, 1878," in the City of Charlottetown.

If the voter is in favor of repealing the Scott Act in Charlottetown he will place a X in the upper space alongside of the words, "For the Petition." If in favor of continuing the Scott Act in Charlottetown the voter will place a in the lower space alongside of the words, "Against the Petition."

If the voter places on the ballot paper more than one mark his vote will not be counted.

This election is for the City of Charlottetown only, and we understand that the residents of the Royalty have no votes. It is even doubtful whether non-residents, owning property or paying rent in the city, are entitled to vote. The better opinion seems to be that actual residence in Charlottetown or Common is necessary to entitle a person (otherwise qualified) to vote.
