NEW YORK, July 21 (AP)—
 The Netherlands guilder rose again
 today in terms of the United
 States dollar while the Shanghai
 dollar took another tumble.
 Advances of 67 cents, demand
 for the guilder was based
 mostly on news from Holland that
 Premier Colijn had a chance of
 forming a cabinet after recent dis-
 tressful foreign exchange traders
 said.
 The Shanghai currency was
 further undermined—1 1/2
 cents to 3 7/8 today—by failure of
 the British Chinese stabilization
 fund to bolster the market.
 The British pound sterling, at
 4.68 1-4 and the French franc at
 2.65 were unchanged while the
 belga and Swiss franc showed low-
 er. The Canadian dollar eased 3-
 64 cent to 1-8 per cent discount.
MONTREAL, July 21 (CP)—
 Pound Sterling held stationary at
 4.68 5-8 and the United States dol-
 lar also was unchanged at 1.00 3-
 32 of Montreal foreign exchange
 today. French francs ruled steady
 at 2.65 3-16.

Actor, Lawyer "Trade" Wives

STORRINGTON, England, July 21 (CP)— A change of wives by
 the Canadian actor Raymond Mas-
 sey and William Dwight Whitney
 was completed today. Massey's
 bride was divorced from
 Dorothy Ludington Whitney (the
 present Miss Massey), prominent
 in New York society, and her law-
 yer husband were divorced July
 15, 1937.
 Massey, star of "Abe Lincoln in
 Illinois" and Miss Allen, his second
 wife, were divorced July 5.
 The actor and Mrs. Whitney were
 married four days later.
 "Our honeymoon will be spent
 in France," Miss Allen said. "I
 am not going to leave the stage
 and my husband and I will spend
 part of each year in England and
 part in the United States."
 One version of the Allen-Whit-
 ney romance was presented by a
 writer for the London Evening
 News who said it started when
 Whitney learned of Miss Allen's
 arrival in the United States to
 start divorce proceedings.
 "Thinking she had few friends in
 America," this reporter said, he
 telephoned her in her New York
 hotel and asked if he could be of
 service, an offer which led to a
 meeting and friendship.
 Whitney was quoted as saying
 "that was the best telephone call
 I've ever made."

Putting Sports Into Art Salon

NEW YORK, July 20— Scenes at
 outstanding United States sports
 events have been captured in water-
 color for posterity by an artist
 whose chief obstacle was winning the
 co-operation of sport promoters.
 They thought they had a men-
 tal patient on their hands when
 Joe Gollink told them of the
 affinity of art and athletics in an-
 cient Greece. He suggested it
 might be revived in this day and
 age to the benefit of boxing and
 finally convinced the hard-boiled
 magnates. Gollink's water colors
 now include scenes from several
 recent heavyweight fights, baseball
 at Yankee Stadium, racing, a
 wrestling match, polo games, horse
 shows, a track meet, a six-day
 bike race and horse show scenes
 in Madison Square Garden.
 "No other artist has been so
 versatile and yet portrayed each
 sport so accurately," an expert said.
 In the ball game, Gollink put
 white uniform on both home and
 visiting clubs.
 "It would have less sparkle if I
 put the visiting team in their tra-
 ditional gray uniforms," explained
 the artist. He admits some critics
 think his work "too colorful."
 Daily for a week he sat on the
 field before games and sent di-
 rectly behind the batting practice
 screen to sketch players. After the
 games he sat alone drawing the
 stands. He did the actual painting
 job in three days.
 At the Joe Louis fight Gollink
 has had to work mighty fast for
 an artist.
