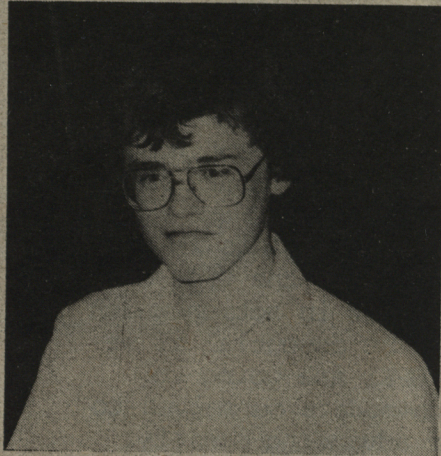


CANDIDATES

TREASURER

Having been Head Bartender. for the past two years, I was in charge of scheduling bar personnel, ordering bar supplies, liquor, and the direction of Campus Police, when the Chief or Asst. Chief were not present. I have also worked Campus Police and have a pretty good idea of what is expected of them. In recent weeks I have been in contact with Patrick Kelly, CIMN Manager, and have discussed the needs and problems of CIMN. As Comptroller for the upcoming year, I would make The Barn a cleaner place for students. I have a plan for speedier and more efficient bar service. For CIMN, a full-time Advertising Manager for the Summer, and a new transmitter.
