## Discuss Life Insurance Act

HALIFAX (CP) — Charles L. Beazley said Monday Canadian insurance superintendents will discuss revisions to the life insurance act at annual sessions here. The three-day meeting began Monday.

Mr. Beazley, president of the Association of Insurance Superintendents for Nova Scotia, said some "almost revolutionary" changes will be considered in proposals at the meeting.

He said that in the next year, the association hopes for new accident, sickness and fire insurance acts. The superintendents, meeting annually since 1917 recommend revisions and amendments to the Uniform Life Insurance Act and the Automobile Insurance Act.

## Canadians Travel And Spend More

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada had nearly as many citizens traveling abroad as she had visitors in 1956—and the Canadians spent more than the visitors.

The bureau of statistics said Monday that 27,700,000 persons visited Canada while 27,200,000 Canadians went abroad. Comparative figures for the previous year were 28,300,000 visitors and 24,800,000 Canadians going out.

This means that 54,900,000 persons travelled between Canada and other countries during the year, a three per cent increase over the 53,200,000 in 1955.

Visitors to Canada last year spent an all-time high of \$338,000,000, up \$9,000,000 or three per cent from the previous year. Americans alone spent \$309,000,000.

Canadian spent nearly \$500,100,000 in other countries, \$49,000,000 or 11 per cent more than in 1955.
