

# Australian Yacht Greets Challenge Today

NEWPORT, R.I. (AP) — A gleaming white sloop named Gretel and its 11 tough, sea-tested crew members from Australia challenge the United States' 11-year supremacy in big boat racing today in the first of a best-of-seven race series for the famed America's Cup.

About 15,000 spectators are expected to take to the Atlantic in an armada ranging from destroyers to small outboards to witness the fight between the unfriended challenger and the American defender, Weatherly.

## Grid Action Seen In U.S. This Weekend

NEW YORK (AP) — The ancient game of picking football winners in advance starts this weekend with seven opening games in the National Football League and three games in the American Football League.

Green Bay looks like the only sure thing opening defense of their NFL title at home against Minnesota Vikings, who are still beset by growing pains.

In the AFL, the crystal ball boys pick Buffalo over Denver, San Diego over New York and Houston over Boston. The Buffalo-Denver game will be the lone Saturday contest.

## Frank Mahovich Sits Out Salary Tiff

TORONTO (CP) — High-scoring left winger Frank Mahovich is back in Toronto — sitting out his salary tiff with Toronto Maple Leafs of the National Hockey League.

He marched out of the Leafs' Peterborough training camp a pouting, but returned to Toronto last night with a new contract.

"I will not return to camp until they get in touch with me," said Mahovich Friday.

"I informed Mr. Imlach last night that I was leaving," he said.

Meanwhile, back at the camp, Imlach was clanking up on prices, but ruminating about suspension.

"I plan no action for two or three days," he said. "If they do not return, I will have no recourse but to suspend him. But that will be a last resort."

In effect, Mahovich is breaking his contract. His contract for last season carries an option for this season and the team has eight weeks to exercise the option.

The 25-year-old left winger scored 33 goals and 38 assists for the Stanley Cup champions last year, and added 10 more goals in the playoffs. He set a team record with 48 goals in 54 games.

Mahovich's walkout was the first break in Imlach's salary negotiations with his team.

The course will be windward-leeward — six miles into the teeth of the wind and six miles back, twice around totalling 24 nautical miles.

Monday, after a layoff Sunday because of an old New York Yacht Club law never to fire a cannon on the Sabbath, will be staged over a triangular course of 24 miles. A cannon always is fired to start a yacht race.

The weather forecast is for light to steady westerly winds ranging from 10 to 20 knots.
