NOTICE TO FARMERS... A few days ago we advised you about the tight credit situation in Canada and that we too would have to tighten our credit if we were to remain in business... We understand that no restrictions as yet has been released on credit, but we are pleased to advise that rediscunt rates has been reduced each day since the high and it is hoped that further reductions in this rate will mature shortly so that the Federal Bank will soon authorize and release some of its restrictions to the Chartered Banks... Our business being feed, seeds, twine, and machinery which ties us up to the farmer and his farm credit problems, and it was unfortunate for us at this time when Ottawa broke the sound barrier of interest rates in Canada as you know at this season many farmers contemplate changing or purchasing new machinery for their fall work and if credit is not available they are unable to do so and with the result the machinery which we have purchased for this season will be carried over for another season, and also at this season each mill is asked by the farmer what he should do with his new stock coming on - keep and feed or sell and take what he can get... We wish to thank all those who have written us and otherwise regarding Farmers credit problems regardless whether or not they thought the Farmers have too much credit but we still have some who can use more credit for the betterment of this Province as a whole.

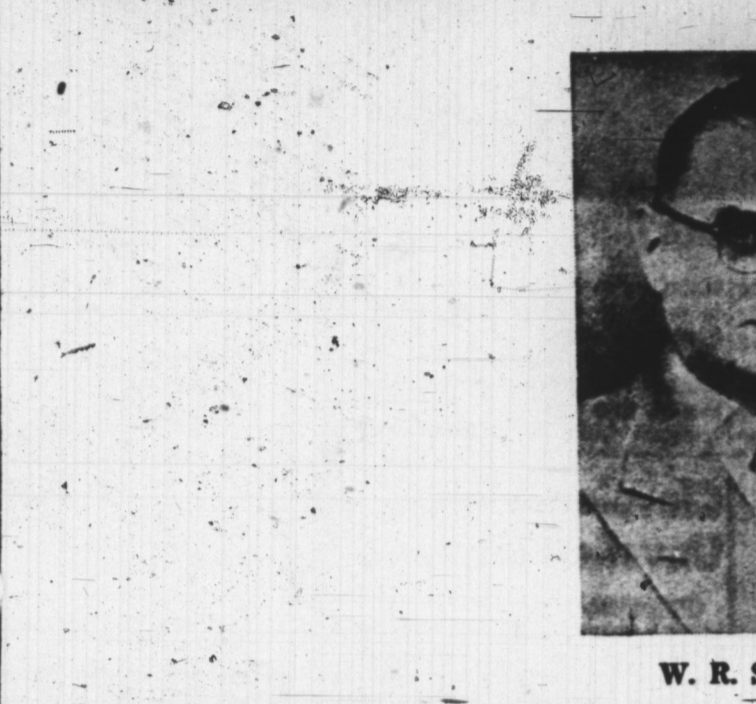
