40 Winter Works Jobs Approved

Forty winter works projects, having a total value of \$615,000, have been approved this season for 24 Island communities.

Covered under the federal-provincial-municipal program are such projects as street repairs, sewage installation, construction of open-air rinks and repairs to municipal buildings. The federal government pays 50 per cent of the payroll costs, while the provincial government and the community involved share equally the balance of payroll costs.

The estimated number of men hired in this province under the program is 617. The projects will provide an estimated 16,125 man-days of employment.

Direct payroll costs of Island projects are estimated at \$165,000.
