

Don MacLeod Hurls Seven Inning No-Hit, No-Run Game

Don "Duck" MacLeod, 17-year-old Charlottetown baseball player, hurled a seven-inning no-hit, no-run game at Memorial Field yesterday evening as the Junior Abbies blanked the Shearwater Flyers 2-0 in the first game of a doubleheader.

MacLeod struck out twelve of the 25 batters who strode to the plate. He walked two and did not allow a man to advance beyond first base. Three Shearwater players reached base through infield errors.

The young Prince of Wales College student struck out the side in the third and fourth innings. From the second inning through to the fifth he struck out all nine batters who were retired.

He got the first two batters he faced in the last inning by forcing them to ground to the infield. Pinch hitter King reached base on an error and then MacLeod struck out Ross to end the game.

The no-hitter was the first in two years. Donnie MacLean hurled a no-hitter against M.C.A. two years ago.

MacLeod also distinguished himself at the plate. He doubled home the insurance run in the second inning and singled in his other time at bat.

Frinder of Shearwater also pitched well. He gave up only five hits. He struck out two men and did not issue a walk.

The Abbies scored once in the first inning and again in the second. Willie Dunn reached first on an infield error, went to third on

Forbes Kennedy's single and scored on Kip Ready's sacrifice fly to the outfield.

There were two out in the second inning when Vern Handrahan singled and scored on MacLeod's double.

There was one double play. Willie Dunn caught Zwicker's liner and fired to Billy Purcell to catch White off base.

Whitlock Homers Twice

Roy "Buck" Whitlock blasted two home runs over the left field fence to lead the Intermediate Abbies to a seven-inning 9-4 victory over Shearwater in the second game of the doubleheader.

Whitlock belted a two-run homer in the first inning on a long drive that scored Eddy Lund ahead of him. He singled in the third inning and then unloaded another homer in the fourth with Cuker Pineau on base.

Elmer MacNeill, who followed Whitlock in the batting order, smashed a drive to the left field fence immediately after Whitlock hit his second. Another foot and MacNeill would have had a four-master.

The Intermediates scored five times in the third inning on singles by Lund, Whitlock, Ralph Pineau and Merlin Devine. Pineau and Devine both drove two runs across the plate with their singles.

Donnie MacLean pitched for the Abbies and allowed seven hits in posting the win. He struck out three and did not issue a walk. Murfitt was the starting pitcher for Shearwater.

Phil Murphy made an outstanding running catch in the centerfield off Stabb for the best fielding play. The throwing of outfielder Elmer "Rifle" MacNeill was another defensive feature. Twice MacNeill fired strikes from the left field fence to Cuker Pineau at third base. Both times he prevented runners from advancing.

Charlie Ryan worked the first game and Glen Matheson the second.

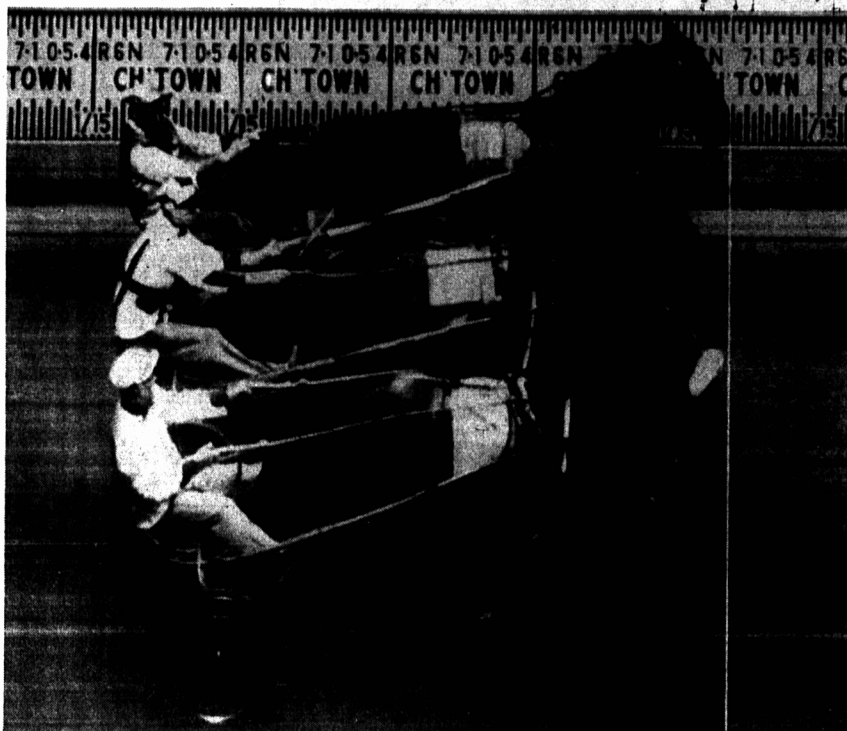
