SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

SECOND QUARTER. WORDS AND WORKS OF JESUS AS RECORDED IN THE GOSPELS.

LESSON IX.—MAY 27.

FEEDING THE FIVE THOUSAND.

Mark, 6:30-44. Memorize verse 41.

GOLDEN TEXT.

My Father giveth you the true bread from heaven.—John 6, 32.

Time.—Early spring, A. D. 28.

Place.—North-east of the Sea of Galilee.

INTRODUCTION.

The feeding of the five thousand is one of the very few events of our Lord's life and the only miracle, apart from the events and miracles of passion week, recorded by all of the evangelist writers. A careful study of this fourfold account brings out very clearly the fact that the evangelists were men of flesh and blood like unto ourselves, with individual traits and characteristics as clearly marked as our own; and that in using these men as his inspired messengers to their own and later generations God did not make of them mere machines, but permitted them to retain free moral agents, in every respect human. Thus we find each giving his own account of this event with a slightly different setting. Each writer emphasizes those details which made the deepest impression on the mind, omitting many others which had either slipped from his memory or which to him seemed of less importance. A careful comparison of the four accounts in details (Matt 14, 13-21; Mark 6, 30-46; Luke 9, 10-17; John 6, 1-15) will bring out clearly this fact, the recognition of which may in turn materially aid in clarifying our notion of the inspiration of the Bible.

EXPLANATION.

30. "The apostles gathered themselves... unto Jesus" Having just returned from a short missionary tour on which he had sent them (Comp. v. 7 of this chapter). "What they had done" and "taught"—They also brought to him news of the death of John the Baptist. (Comp. Matt. 14, 12, 13)

31. "Into a desert place"—Across the lake (v. 32; John 6, 1), north of the Sea of Galilee. "Many coming and going"—On the public highways, to and from every village and household, at this festive passover season. (Comp. John 6, 4)

32. "And ran afoot thither"—The walk along the northern shore of the lake was not much farther than the shorter course by boat, possibly not quite as far as the course which the boat was compelled to take.

33. His coming forth seems to have been not from the boat, but from a mountainside retreat, to which he had first retired with his disciples after leaving the boat. (Comp. John 6, 3, 5: "And Jesus went up into a mountain, and there he sat with his disciples... When Jesus then lifted up his eyes and saw a great company.")

34. "Two hundred pennyworth"—Two hundred denarii, about thirty-three and one-third dollars.
