This rave/techno/dance compilation bills itself as the soundtrack to an upcoming racing video game, and this comparison fits quite nicely. Expect many repetitive blips and squeaks, nearly no vocals, and a throbbing beat with each song. Many current 'flavours of the month' have tracks here, including the Future Sounds of London, the Chemical Brothers (sans Noel Gallagher), Underworld and a wonderful instrumental Prodigy remix. Taken in the proper context (ie. at a night club or while playing video games), this CD would fit in perfectly as background noise. This type of music is an acquired taste anyway, so if you have always wanted to sample many different artists in the same genre, this is the ideal CD. There are enough good tracks on here (including Orbital, the Prodigy, and others) to compensate for the mostly forgettable Daft Punk and Photek. If, however, you despise the sound of computer-generated noise, stay far, far away from this CD.
