West dealer.

The bidding:  
West North East South  
Pass Pass Pass 1♥  
Pass 4♥

Opening lead—ten of spades.  
Some years ago I was partnered with Howard Schenken in a national team-of-four championship played in Cincinnati. The match was going along quite satisfactorily, our opponents having stepped out of line several times with disastrous results, when the hand shown arose.  
My fourth hand opening heart bid with the South hand drew a long huddle from my partner and the result of his deliberations was a leap directly to game in hearts. The trend of Schenken's thoughts became obvious as the play progressed.  
At the opening spade lead was made and he put down the dummy, he commented: "We might have missed seven." When East won the spade, Schenken remarked quietly "no seven." The diamond and return was won by West's ace, Schenken saying "and no six."  
In the meantime, I was having a quiet little conversation with myself which ran: "and no five, and no four either," and it took all my will power to refrain from joining Schenken in his persistent ditty.  
West returned a diamond. I trumped in dummy and led the queen of hearts. This play had a miraculous effect because it succeeded in destroying both the king and jack of trump with one blow and avoided a trump loser. My worries were not yet over because there was still a danger of losing two club tricks, but the clubs turned out to be favorably placed, and the contract was made after all.  
The queen of hearts play was no stroke of genius on my part and was more lucky than clever. Only two combinations exist to avoid a trump loser, the actual case and the one where East has a singleton king. Both possibilities are equally likely, but in the former case, the queen must be led, while in the latter, a small trump from dummy must be played if a loser is to be avoided.  
The only advantage of the queen play is that East may make the mistake of not covering with the king whenever he is dealt K-x, in which case larceny becomes the keynote to success.
