The bidding went:

West made his three-heart contract, for game and rubber, with the greatest of ease—in fact, he collected an extra trick.

Since this result was in decided contrast to the four spades which North-South could have made with equal facility, it was only natural that these players should have been somewhat disgruntled and that they promptly expressed their respective sentiments.

South insisted that his two-club overall had been correct, particularly at the score, and considering that he had a singleton heart. He maintained that a take-out double of one diamond would have been rash; that it was likely that North would respond with hearts (and perhaps keep on bidding that suit) at a level which South could not protect.

North was not convinced. "You certainly don't think," he said, "that I could enter the bidding with one queen in my hand, simply because you had overcalled with two clubs! But if you had doubled one diamond, I would have come in with my six-card suit, and then you could have easily carried on in spades at least to the four level."

Without doubt, there was quite a bit of logic in the position of both North and South, but it does seem that North had the better of the argument. The fact that South was unprepared for one suit, hearts; did not invalidate a takeout double of one diamond, since he could protect himself up to a reasonable level by bidding clubs or at need, spades.
