Vegetable Tariffs Under Attack

OTTAWA (CP) - Some proposed tariff changes on imports of United States fruits and vegetables are contrary to the health, welfare, comfort and pleasure of thousands of Canadians, Senator Arthur Roebuck (L - Ontario) said Wednesday.
The producer is the servant of the consumer, he told the Senate.
Production must precede consumption, replied Senator Cyrille Vaillancourt (L - Quebec) during Senate discussion of a bill to amend the customs tariff.
The measure set forth in the April 9 budget, revises tariffs on 142 items including a number of fruits and vegetables. Before voting to send the bill to committee for study, the Senate debate covered assorted views on just what target tariffs should aim at.
As explained in April, the fruit and vegetable revisions mean, for one thing, that Canadian prices will be inclined to hold up during the Canadian harvest season - a result of protection given the home producer from cheap imports.
Generally speaking, Senator Roebuck said, such tariff items are in the interest of the producer rather than the consuming public.
The proposed extensions of time during which some tariffs would apply to certain imported fruits and vegetables wouldn't help to bring lower prices in time of market plenty.
Quebec, describing himself as a farm-born, said he'd always felt farmers should have reasonable

Aid Overlaps Says Pearson

OTTAWA (CP) - Lester B. Pearson, former Canadian external affairs minister, Wednesday suggested that international agencies providing various forms of aid to underdeveloped countries should be "pulled together in some way" to avoid overlapping and confusion.
The opposition leader said in the Commons that in the field of international economic assistance there seems to be a proliferation of agencies. Perhaps, the time had come to try to band them together to avoid overlapping.
He said the agencies also should be kept in as close relationship as possible with the United Nations and be as international in character as possible. In that way, political pressure for particular lines of action by one member could be kept to the minimum.
Mr. Pearson spoke as the Commons approved a government proposal to introduce legislation increasing Canada's commitment to the world bank to \$750,000,000 from \$325,000,000 and to the International Monetary Fund to \$550,000,000 from \$300,000,000.
He said that if the U.S. hadn't exerted pressure for political reasons to prevent a world bank loan to Egypt to build the high Aswan dam the "catastrophe" of Suez in 1956 would have been avoided.
Speaking later, Finance Minister Fleming said the best evidence that the international character of the bank and fund are being preserved is the fact that 68 countries were represented at the last annual meeting in New Delhi last fall.
