WINNIPEG (CP)—Prices generally showed a firm undertone Thursday on the Winnipeg grain exchange and trading was featured by a fair export business in barley. It was estimated that more than a cargo of barley was sold overseas. Overnight export loadings of Canadian wheat included United Kingdom 555,000 bushels, Belgium 800,000, Italy 100,000, Germany 625,000, West Indies 375,000, and small parcels to Jamaica and Venezuela. New York Stocks
NEW YORK, (AP)—The stock market was forced down Thursday in one of the sharpest falls of the year. All sections of the market were involved in the sell-off. Railroads, however, resisted the decline and managed to show small gains at the close. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell \$1.40 at \$134.70. The industrial component of the average slumped \$2.30, railroad were off 70 cents and utilities were down 50 cents. Canadian stocks were lower. Canadian Pacific was down 1-2. Dome Mines and Distillers Seagram each down 1-4 and International Nickel down 3-4. Royalite Oil, a Canadian issue on the American stock exchange, was off 3-8. What stocks did: Thur. Wed.

Montreal Stocks
MONTREAL, (CP)—Prices were irregularly lower at the close of the stock market Thursday. St. Lawrence Corporation lost 1-2 points while Asbestos and Building Products each slipped 3-4 point. Half-point losses were posted by Noranda, Bathurst B. Dominion Bank and Power Corporation. Canadian Industries, International Nickel and BA Oil each dipped 1-4 point. Imperial Oil and Atlatli were narrowly easier. Dominion Stores was 1-2 point better and Bathurst A advanced 3-8. Quarter-point improvements were scored by Canadian Celanese and Bell Telephone. Other higher issues were Gaitneau and Algoma Steel.

Miscellaneous industrials, papers, beverages, senior metals and senior oils lost ground while utilities and steels showed a mixed pattern. Carriers and banks were mainly unchanged. Mines were narrowly easier. Lorado uranium went against the trend, gaining 18 cents. Western oils were trendless.
