Livestock Entries

Number Over 1,370 For Winter Fair

AMHERST, Oct. 20

Statistics on the entry lists for the 1951 Maritime Winter Fair released yesterday by Secretary Manager R. F. MacCunn showed a total of 1,372 head of livestock entered for competition in this year's show. The fair will open in Amherst, Nov. 1 and continue until Nov. 7 with livestock judging scheduled each day. Mr. MacCunn said all stalls will be filled with the livestock expected to start moving in the latter part of next week. The entry is about the same as last year with a slight decrease in some breeds and an increase in others. The majority of the veteran exhibitors are again showing this year with a marked number of new exhibitors taking part. The Holstein classes have the largest number with 167 entries. The biggest herds are those of C. Lewis of Freetown, P. E. I., C. Lusby, Amherst; Premier J. Walter Jones, Charlottetown, and Lewis Brothers of York, P. E. I. The latter has entered 34 head, one of the largest entries of a single breed ever recorded at a fair. The Jerseys with 140 entries rank second in the cattle breeds. Edison Much, of North River, P. E. I., and Charles Robison and Sons, Harvey, have the largest herds with 17 each. Some of the other large exhibitors in this class include Stirling Bros. and Sons, Harvey; W. S. Taylor, Rothsay, and Fundy Jersey Farm, Truro, N. S. A total of 124 Guernseys, a considerable increase over last year, have been entered. S. Main and Sons, Denmore Mills, have the largest herd with 19. While other exhibitors with big entries include Walter West, Moncton; F. W. Saunders, Aylesford; Howard Roper, Princeport; Guy Ross, Brackley, P. E. I., and E. B. Leonard, Bridgetown.

Ayrshires Down

The Ayrshire entry is down slightly but a total of 114 herd had been entered by MacRae and Son, Charlottetown, and a top entry of 19 white others with large herds in this breed include Hon. A. C. Taylor, Salisbury; Roger Bacon, Amherst; Col. S. C. Oland, Halifax; Stanley Hennigar, Denmore Mills, and Keith Boswell, Victoria, P. E. I. In the best classes, the Short-horns with 59 entries top the Herefords with 55. The big exhibitors in the Short-horns include H. F. Carter and Sons, Aulac, who have 18 head; Charles Trenholm, Fort Lawrence; Cedric Carter, Aulac; George Chase, Port Williams, and Cyrus Eaton, Upper Blandford, N. S. James O'Brien of Windsor has the largest Hereford entry with 16 head along with Hazen Cail. Ford's Mills; Miller Sanderson and Fulton Sanderson of North River, P. E. I. A. Boswell, Charlottetown, has the largest sheep entry, followed by Premier J. B. McNair, Fredrickton, W. A. Ballantyne, New Glasgow; W. S. Stewart and Son, Charlottetown, and Ernest Falkner, Caribou Island, are next. W. S. Stewart and Son also have the largest swine entry closely followed by Almon Boswell, Reid, Pulpwood, Company and Charles Hayes, of Tintin. An R. O. P. Shorthorn cattle class has been entered this year with nine entries, seven by A. M. Jenkins of Gagetown. This is the first class of this kind for many years.
