

# Drifting Cruiser Towed To Safety

SUMMERSIDE — An intimate knowledge of coastal waters and tidal conditions enabled federal Fisheries Officer Lloyd Heckbert to rescue five persons aboard a cabin cruiser whose engine stalled while cruising in the Northumberland Strait Sunday afternoon.

Drifting helplessly in thick fog, the cruiser was located by Fisheries Officer Heckbert shortly before midnight on Sunday, after a search which began when the boat had failed to return to harbour at Summerside before dark.

On board the boat which was towed back to Summerside were the owner, a construction contractor, Charles Forbes, his wife, two of their children, and another guest, a companion of the children.

After being stopped briefly while cruising in the Strait, the boat's motor refused to start despite the use of an auxiliary battery, and the boat drifted helplessly for several hours until located by Mr. Heckbert who had gone in search of it when he learned the cabin cruiser was a few hours overdue in returning to harbour.

A strong searchlight aboard the Fisheries patrol boat, owned by Mr. Heckbert, proved ineffective in the search due to the thick fog, and a light on the mist boat eventually led to its location in an area of the Strait of Sea Cow Head, much to the elated joy of the occupants. The rescue was similar to several others that federal fisheries officers have performed in Island waters in recent years.

Mr. Biggar is a married man with two small children and will reside in Montague. He is a qualified life guard and has distinguished himself in several sports, particularly as a long distance swimmer.
