Nfld Union Leader Resigns

CORNER BROOK, Nfld. (CP)—Pierce Fudge, president and founder of the 5,000-member Newfoundland Laborers' Union, has tendered his resignation for reasons of health.

Mr. Fudge made the announcement after union members decided Tuesday night to affiliate with the International Carpenters and Joiners of America (I.C.J.).

Th Carpenters and Joiners and the International Woodworkers Association of America (I.W.A.) have applied to the Newfoundland labor relations board for certification to annex the NLU and Newfoundland's three other independent unions, mainly representing loggers employed by the island's two paper companies.

Mr. Fudge said he would remain in office until the NLU receives a charter from the Carpenters and Joiners and annual elections Aug. 15.

The NLU was organized in 1938 by Mr. Fudge. It has labor agreements with six companies, representing loggers, longshoremen, mechanical workers and unskilled laborers.

The three other unions involved are the Newfoundland Lumbermen's Association of Grand Falls, Workmen's Central Protective Union of Deer Lake and Fishermen's Protective Union of Port Union.

IN MEMORIAM

J.C.P. BAGNALL

The death occurred at Hazel Grove on May 22, 1957, of James Colledge Pope Bagnall. He was born on the homestead, October 19, 1872, where he lived the most of his life except for certain periods, which he spent in travelling to Cuba, and later to points in the United States and Canada.

He was the fourth son of the late John Sims Bagnall and his wife, Margaret Ross, and was the last surviving member of their family.

PIONEERS

He was a grandson of Richard Bagnall who was the first to settle in that part of the country about 1810, and was a grand nephew of John Cantello, who gave the name Hazel Grove to that neighborhood.

Mr. Bagnall was a very successful farmer and miller and it was in the latter capacity, that he came to know, all the residents of that part for many miles around.

His dealings with the public were above reproach.

He had a true love for milling, and had an eye for, and whole- some respect of good lumber seldom seen today. To him milling was an art.

To see him skillfully place a giant log fresh from the forest on the table and cut cleanly through it, (with the whirr of the saw, and the music of the waters over the dam, in ones ears) and to see him with that quietness and dignity pecu- liar to him, take from that log the very last board, was some- thing unforgettable, and belongs to a day now fled.

He was married in 1904 to Miss Phebe Ann Pound of Fredericton who was his faithful wife and companion for well over fifty years and who nursed him through a long period of sickness to the end.

The hospitality of their home is a byword. All who came to their

door, were invited in, and made welcome.
