THE SITUATION. INSURRECTIONS!

Trouble Between Turkish and Russian Troops.

Special Dispatch to Examiner: CONSTANTINOPLE, April 23.

The Grand Duke Nicholas has proposed to the Seraskier to send a mixed commission of Russian and Turkish officers to the scene of the conflict between armed Muslims and Russian troops mentioned in a dispatch from this city last night.

The Porte is not acquainted with the exact nature of this insurrection; but it is supposed that the insurgents consist of three battalions of the former garrison of Nisch, who, on retreating to the mountains, joined the scattered remains of Suleiman Pasha's army.

Another insurrection of Musulman's has broken out in Macedonia. The commandant at Moastier has sent for troops, and the Russians have also despatched forces to the scene.

ST. PETERSBURG, April 23. The Agence Russe says: "The situation is unchanged." The Grand Duke Nicholas will return here in about ten days.

PARIS journals state that invitations to a Congress to examine changes necessary in existing treaties have been semi-officially communicated to several Powers.

THE Daily News' leading article says that the policy of the British is becoming a matter of growing importance.

Captain Oliver, of the bark Chili, of Yarmouth, N. S., has been arrested at Philadelphia, charged with the murder at sea of the first mate, A. C. Krutz.
