**CONTRACT BRIDGE**

we concern ourselves only with those pairs who did.

About half the declarers who played this contract made four hearts, while the other half managed to go down. Since the failure to make the hand is traceable to a simple play overlooked by the unsuccessful declarers, it may serve a useful purpose to examine the play and see what it was that went wrong.

The crucial play comes early. Declarer wins the diamond lead with the ace, cashes the king of clubs, and returns a diamond. West takes the jack and continues with the queen. East having signaled high-low in diamonds. If South ruffs in dummy with the eight, which is what the declarers who went down did, East overruffs with the ten, returns a spade, and declarer is defeated, losing four tricks.

Of course, this line of play would succeed if West had been dealt the ten of hearts, and to that extent is unlucky. But the correct line of play does not require the element of luck to be successful.

The proper play is not to trump the third round of diamonds, but to discard a spade from dummy and allow the queen of diamonds to win the trick. This gives the defenders their second trick.

South cannot now be prevented from making the contract. He has three spades left and dummy one. He concedes a spade, ruffs one in dummy, and discards the other on the ace of clubs.

**Report Pilot-ejection Soon To Become An Impossibility**

HALIFAX (CP)—A Canadian naval medical officer said here today modern aircraft are almost to the point where pilot-ejection is going to be impossible.

Cmdr. H. D. Oliver, medical officer at the Shearwater naval station near here, told the Canadian Medical Association human and mechanical limitations will make it impossible for a pilot to be shot from a plane without striking the tailfin or suffering severe vertebral injury.

Cmdr. Oliver said the limiting factors involved are the human spine and the length of stroke in mechanisms used in the ejection seat.

He said efforts to overcome these factors have been aimed at development of a system "that tackles both at once." To reduce the impact on the spine, a supporting harness surrounding the upper torso was developed. "In this way when the seat is fired, the pilot is partly pulled out and partly pushed out."

**NO ROOM FOR ERROR**

Cmdr. Oliver said the RCN has solved a problem in linear acceleration "purely by adapting the machine" in the twin-engine tracker. High acceleration is forced on short take-offs on the deck of Canada's aircraft carrier Bonaventure. This is accentuated under certain wind conditions.

While the speeds "are well tolerated physiologically, there is a certain amount of disorientation and loss of co-ordination," he said. "Under instrument conditions or at night, it does not take much of an error in movement of the control column" to cause an accident.

To avoid the situation, an automatic pilot has been installed in the aircraft to operate it during take-off.

Cmdr. Oliver spoke during the CMA's scientific session on armed forces medicine.

**No Money For Hotel Extension**

HALIFAX (CP) — President Gerald Kowal of the Lord Nelson Hotel Company said Monday night a 130-room addition to the hotel won't be built because "Money was not available through the usual channels."

He said originally "it had been expected that financing would be available through government sources interested in expanding the Nova Scotia tourist industry."

Nova Scotia's Trade and Industry Minister Manson said "no commitments have been made to the Lord Nelson Hotel Company by the present government."

The company had planned a \$2,400,000 project for the hotel to include the 130 rooms, a 1,000-seat convention hall and a dining room. He said now the Kowal family will sign a \$1,000,000 contract in a few days with a Halifax construction company for all but the 130-room addition.

**Newsprint Can Become Obsolete**

GRAND FALLS, Nfld. (CP) — President T. R. Moore of the Anglo- Newfoundland Development Company warned Monday night newsprint could become obsolete in the future "when we consider the wonders of science and engineering today."

He told a service club it is time for "down to earth talk. . . . We must take heed of the danger signals that those of us who are closest to the newsprint industry can see very clearly."

He said if newsprint becomes too expensive "a cheaper substitute will be found."

Canada and U.S. were experiencing a recession having an adverse affect on newsprint consumption.




