Thursday morning January 19th,
1956, Stephen Murphy passed away
at the King's County Hospital, Mon-
treal, P.E.I. The sad news of his
leath was given to his widow by
Reverend John Cash, at her home
in Summerville.

Mr. Murphy had entered the hos-
pital for observation, one week pre-
vious to his suffering a fatal heart
attack. The last rites of the Catho-
lic Church were administered by
Reverend Wilfred McCordle, past-
or of St. Mary's Church, Montague.

Stephen Murphy was born in
Summerville, King's County thirty
seven years ago, the son of Daniel
and the late Mrs. (Mary Kelly)
Murphy. In the Scriptural sense
Stephen Murphy was a "Just man".
He was a man filled with Charity
for God and his fellow man. His
charity was manifested by his con-
stant smile, good humor and will-
ingness to give a helping hand to
all in need. He was a kind husband
and loving father, all were touched,
who has the privilege to observe
the tenderness, love and patience
manifested with his children.

The loss of this considerate hus-
band and attentive father will be
keenly felt.

Left to mourn his call from this
life are his wife, the former Fran-
cine Kenny of Brooklyn, N.Y., and
four small children, soon to be
five. Kenny Francis, Andrew Reg-

brothers and three sisters also sur-

One brother Frank predeceased
him fifteen months ago.

The funeral was held from his
late residence to St. Joachim's
Church, Vernon River. Reverend
Urban Gillis, P.P. met the re-
mains at the entrance of the church
for Requiem High Mass was
celebrated by his brother-in-law,
Reverend Albert Kenny of Brook-
lyn, N.Y., assisted by Reverend
Urban Gillis, P.P. as deacon and
Reverend John Cash as sub-deacon.
Reverend Father Cash also of-
ficiated at the grave.

The profusion of mass offerings,
spiritual bouquets and floral trib-
utes and the great crowds in at-
tendance at the wake and funeral,
attested to the high esteem and af-
fection in which the deceased was
held.

may he have eternal rest."

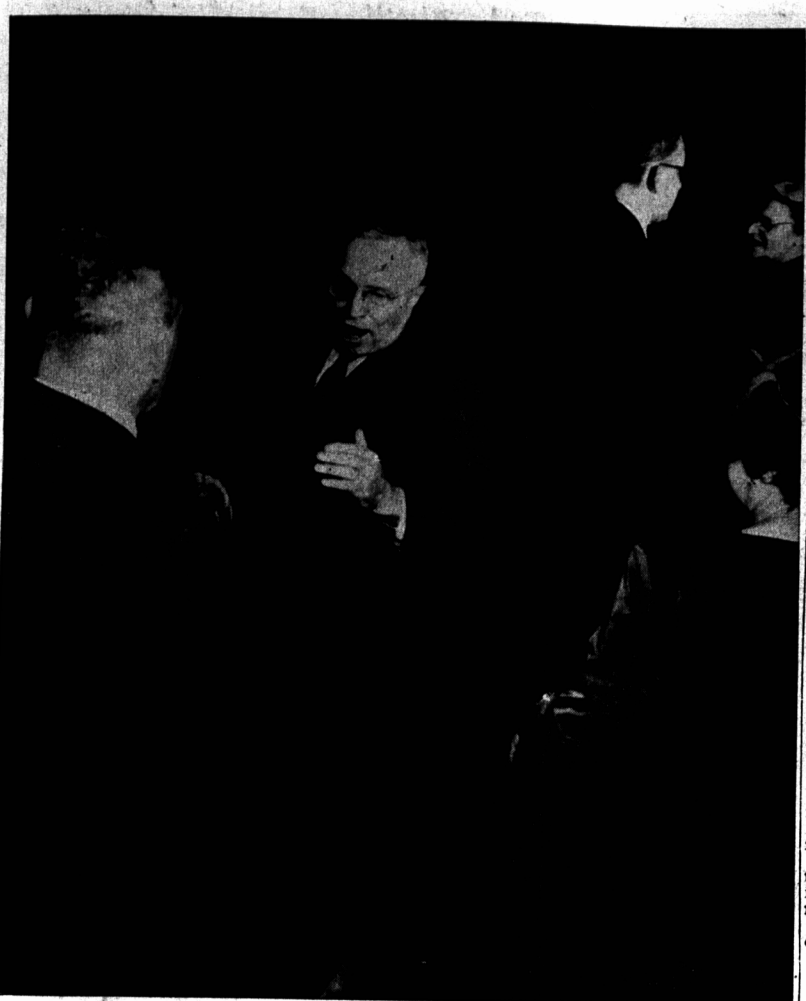

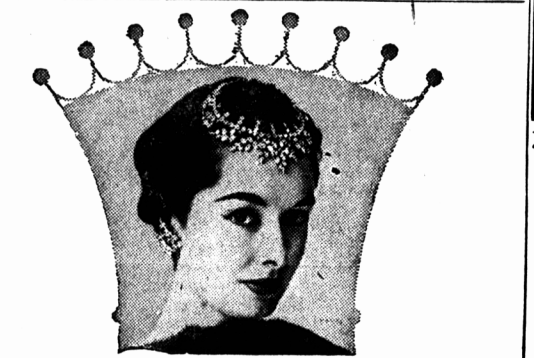
