**P.E.I. Veterinarians Hold Annual Dinner, Meeting**

"I see a good future for the veterinary medical profession in this Province", Premier A. W. Matheson told members of the P. E. Island Veterinary Medical Association at their annual dinner meeting held at the Charlottetown Hotel last night. Premier Matheson referred in detail to an article appearing in the year book of 1915 in which was reproduced verbatim an article by a former editor of the Guardian, late J.E.B. McCready. The article dealt with the raising, feeding and care of animals. "This appears to be the only authoritative article on the subject available up to that time in our records," the Premier said.

"It is only within the last ten years that your profession has come to the fore, and more particularly in the last few years," the Premier continued. "You are in constant touch with the farmers of the Province and are able to be of service to them in every phase of livestock activity. Mutual confidence and close co-operation cannot fail to produce results of the utmost benefit to our rural citizens."

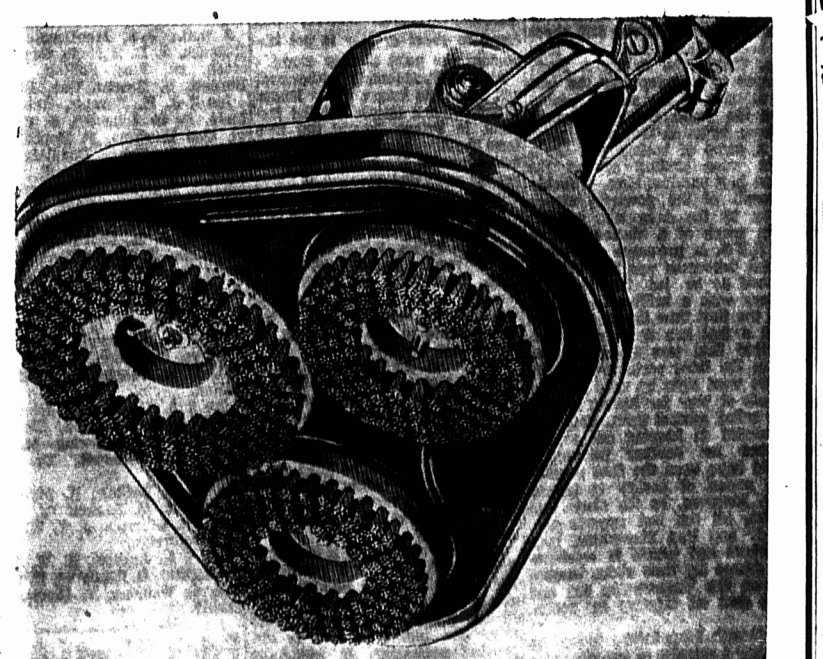
