### Motorship Sinks After Collision At Sea

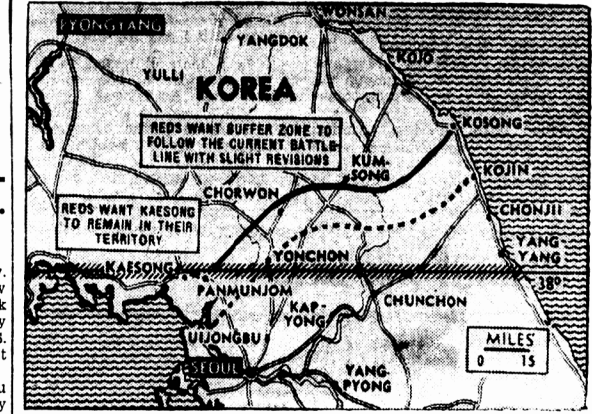
### Railways Move For Quick Increase In Freight Rates

OTTAWA, Nov. 4 (CP)—In a new manoeuvre aimed at circumventing expected delay in freight-rate hearings, the railways Saturday called for a quick temporary increase of five per cent in their tolls.

The proposed "interim" boost is roughly half what the carriers already were seeking on an established basis before the Board of Transport Commissioners, which only Friday postponed hearings indefinitely from Nov. 12.
