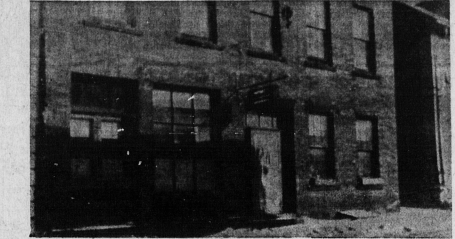
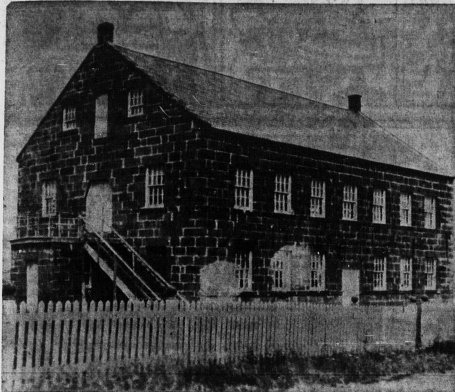

husband we will forward them to you."

Some years later Mrs. Brawders purchased from George Beer "for and in consideration of the sum of seventy pounds of lawful money of Prince Edward Island" part of Town lot number ninety two (92) in the fourth hundred of lots.

The property was described as "commencing at the north west corner of the said lot and running along Fitzroy Street for the distance of eighty four feet, thence running south east seventy feet, thence running south west across the said lot eighty four feet and thence north west along Cumberland Street seventy feet to the place of commencement."

The differences in spelling in various documents in those days is noticeable in this deed as the purchaser's name is several times spelled Brothers.

The deed is signed by George Beer and M. A. Beer (his wife) and witnessed by Robert Hyndman and Charles Desbrassy.

Also noted on the document is the statement: "I certify that the within release was duly registered on the eighteenth day of January A.D. 1868 at three o'clock P.M. on oath of Charles Desbrassy Esquire—

The above was signed by John A. Dingwell, Registrar.

Apprenticeship paper with old documents

While there are a great many old documents of a legal and other nature still in existence, owners of them apparently are not always willing to make them public. However, there are exceptions.

In possession of a Charlottetown lady are documents which belonged to her grandmother more than a century ago and she has kindly made them available to this paper for examination and inclusion in this special edition.

One of them is an ancient letter from St. John's Nfld., to a Mrs. Ellen Brawders, of Charlottetown, confirming news she had received of the death of her husband, a seaman of the time.

It was from the agent of John Cusack and Sons in answer to one Mrs. Brawders had written and though the date is missing and age has made parts of the letter illegible most of

It is available. It acknowledges her letter and states: "We regret the pain of informing you that it is too true that your husband, James Brawders is dead. He was washed off the Jib Boom of the War Hawk (?) six days after leaving this port in February last. The vessel has not since returned to St. John's but is expected in about a month. handed down in the same family for generations is an "indenture of apprenticeship to the trade of Cabinet Maker between William Brawders, Apprentice with Ellen Brawders, mother, to John Newson, Cabinet maker."

For a term of five years the youth agreed "He shall do no damage to his master, or his master's property, or see it done by others, and shall forthwith give warning to his said master of the same. Nor shall he lend his master's goods to any person without his master's consent. He shall not commit fornication nor contract matrimony within his said term, nor shall he play at cards or any unlawful game or games whereby his master shall have any loss with his own funds or others during the said term without the advice of his said master. He shall not hunt fowls, nor play horses, or absent himself from the service of his

said master, day or night unlawfully."

In return he was to be taught the trade of cabinet maker and was to be paid the sum of twenty five pounds each year for the first four years and thirty pounds for the final year. His mother had to provide the boy with room and board, clothing, etc.

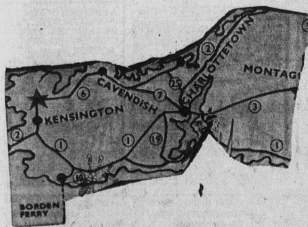
