Says Mulgrave Mill Talks Fail

SYDNEY (CP)—The Cape Breton Post says provincial government negotiations to establish a new pulp mill at Mulgrave, N.S. on the Strait of Canso have failed. The paper reports that talks between government officials and the Parsons and Whittemore Co. of New York were broken off abruptly this week after the company objected to the high cost of electric power at Mulgrave. The government now intends to negotiate with Swedish interests about a proposed mill, the paper says.

Earlier talks with Scott Paper Co. of Pennsylvania on the prospects of ulding a pulp mill ended when the company purchased a site for future development near New Glasgow on Northumberland Strait. The Post says Industry Minister Wilfred Dauphinee plans to make a statement on the latest negotiations Friday.

Admiral Has Heart Attack

VICTORIA (CP)—Rear-Admiral H. F. Pullen, flag officer of the Pacific Coast, suffered a minor heart attack Sunday, the navy announced Tuesday. His condition is considered excellent, a spokesman for the RCN hospital in Esquimalt said. The attack came just four days after the Navy Day celebrations here—one of the largest peacetime shows in Pacific Coast history—shows in Pacific Coast history for a former officer for most of his career. Rear-Admiral Pullen, a sea-going career, was appointed flag officer July 7, 1955.

Prominent Navy Civil Servant Retiring Aug. 31

OTTAWA (CP)—Richard (Dickie) Pearson, 67, one of the navy's top civil servants, will retire Aug. 31 after a naval career spanning all but four years of the history of the Royal Canadian Navy. Known to his friends as "Mr. Navy," he has been a familiar figure around naval headquarters for the last 37 years. Mr. Pearson since 1948 has been director of technical services, personnel and requirements and executive assistant to the chief of naval technical services. A native of England, Mr. Pearson served for three years as a member of the Royal Naval Reserve before coming to Canada in 1914.

He was in Mexico on the outbreak of the First World War serving as engineer of a freighter. He left his ship for New York where he was ordered to report to HMS Good Hope in Halifax. However, the ship sailed before he got to Halifax and was lost in the battle of Coronel. Mr. Pearson transferred to the Royal Canadian Navy and served on the Earl Grey as an unarmored government icebreaker later delivered to Russia. After his return from Archangel, he served on one of the two submarines stationed on the Pacific coast. After further service with the navy on the East and West coasts, he accepted a civil service position with the navy in 1919 under the then consulting engineer at naval headquarters. The two made up Saturday after crossing the St. Marys River
