be compared to similar provinces namely Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba which have to export a goodly percentage of their egg production.

A review of prices being paid producers in provinces with production surpluses will show prices similar with a few exceptions. Prince Edward Island producers are receiving as high a price for Grade A Large as in any of the surplus provinces but not as much for Grade A Medium and Grade B eggs.

It is reported that the so-called Government support price should assure the producer a price of 29c for Grade A Medium eggs. It is noted that the Provinces paying the 29c Medium price are storing eggs under price support. Perhaps the answer to increased prices for Grade A Medium eggs in Prince Edward Island is the storing of eggs under support prices.

Production of eggs is holding steady and the product is moving freely to market at present levels. Operators of grading stations are quoting producers for ungraded eggs delivered: Grade A Large 32-3, A Medium 27-7, B 22-1 (Charlottetown) At Summerside-Grade A Large 33, A Medium 28, Grade B 25. O'Leary-Grade AL 31, Grade A Medium 26, Grade B 22. Montague-Grade A Large 31, Grade A Medium 26, Grade B 22.

A difference in paying price among centres will be noted. This does not mean that some grading stations are deliberately paying less than others but have a lower price due to extra charges in moving the product to market, whilst others probably have a retail outlet for a goodly portion of their receipts.

Dealers are quoting operators of grading stations for the graded pack, delivered Grade A Large 38, Grade AM 33, Grade AS 30, Grade B 30, Grade C 26. Here again, these prices are possibly lower than are paid in some centres outside the province but it must be remembered that these are delivered prices, therefore, the express or freight charge must be deducted from outside prices if an accurate comparison is to be made.

Eggs are wholesaling to retailers at Grade AL 41-3, Grade AM 36-8, Grade AS 33-5, Grade B 33-5.

Retailers are quoting consumers for the graded product Grade AL 45-50, Grade AM 39-43, Grade B 40. The spread in prices within grades in some cases is the difference in eggs packaged in paper bags and cartons. Cartons cost 3c, therefore, cartoned eggs should be worth 3c a dozen more than those sold in ordinary paper bags. In some other cases, the difference in price is due to just taking all the market will command.

remarked that some of the Ministers in the Cabinet promoted the idea that increased production was the solution to inflation but for his part he was not prepared to advise farmers to increase production of most agricultural products; our increased dependence on the Canadian domestic market for Agricultural products with the possible exception of western grains was becoming more apparent.

Coarse grains.

The eastern livestock feeder on the other hand feels that Wheat Board policies should be extended to take into consideration the welfare of the livestock industry. Coarse grains were brought under the Wheat Board at the request of the western provinces supported by the five eastern provinces which hoped that the Wheat Board would keep in mind not only the interests of the west but those of the east as well.

However, the Wheat Board when given the marketing of coarse grains was instructed to market these in the best interest of the grain grower hence the present demand on the part of the east that the Federal Government should assume some responsibility in seeing that we obtain some relief from the uncertainty of supply, slow deliveries, rapid and wide fluctuations in price and payment of premiums due to short supply.

Immigration

Immigration came up for discussion at the annual meeting and the resolution from western Canada suggesting that preference and encouragement should be given to settlers from the British Isles, was carefully scrutinized after Quebec delegates requested that France be added to the preferred list.

The open meeting finally decided that what was required was good immigrants and that it didn't make any difference what country they came from.

Milk Prices

Dr. E.C. Hope, Federation Economist, in a recent analysis of milk prices comes to the following conclusions on this question. The average price of milk at July 1st, 1951 was 19 1/2 cents a quart in Canada a figure which Dr. Hope concludes to be 1 1/2 cents lower than the normal long time relationship between milk prices and wage rates.

Other conclusions are as follows:

(1) Since 1928 producer prices for fluid milk (Class 1) have followed fairly closely the changes in the index of the cost of things farmers buy. But by July 1951, producer prices were falling well below the cost index.

Farm Organizations

"More individual responsibility." P.E.I. Farm Forums think would stir up more enthusiasm among farmers for our local Farm organizations. The majority of Forum answers to Farm Forum Guide question one, brought out this opinion. "More rural meetings with films and speakers. More publicity about Federation projects. A National magazine edited or published by the Federation monthly, twice monthly, or weekly which would cover all aspects of farming," wrote the members of Malpeque Farm Forum.
