With identical values in two suits, and a weak hand to boot, it is better to start at the bottom of the ladder in responding. If partner dislikes clubs, he has the opportunity of showing diamonds in the two level. If we responded two diamonds instead there would not be the corresponding opportunity of finding clubs without going into the three level.

2. Three clubs. We can't bid two clubs here and also on the previous hand and expect partner to know that this time we have a good hand. The usual way of showing strength opposite a double is by making a jump response. In general, a jump response is made with hands containing 10 or more high-card points. Where there are attractive distributional features, the requirements for a jump response are of course lower.

3. To notrump. Even though the doubler nearly always expects a suit response, it is better here to stress the flat distribution while identifying the high-card values by the jump bid. Game in clubs is remote, compared to the possibility of game in notrump and a response of three clubs is therefore inadvisable. The two notrump response is generally based on 11 or 12 high-card points which include at least one stopper in the opponent's suit.

4. Two hearts. You respond in hearts instead of diamonds, despite the difference in high-card strength, because partner is more likely to bid again if there is a possibility of a major suit game. You should have some interest in a game because you have values clearly in excess of those usually held opposite a double.

5. Four hearts. Game is probable after the double, and since there is no real doubt that the hand will play best in hearts, we should bid the game directly. We have only nine high-card points, but lots of winning tricks. Heart support from North is practically guaranteed by the

which I think would have affected the cultural life of the entire province," Mr. Gray said.

"I am very sorry I was not given more of a free hand in the past, but evidently the powers that be do not want it that way. I hope my successor has a better opportunity than I had."

Mr. Gray said it was an ambitious undertaking to operate a 1,000-seat theatre in an area with a small playing attendance.

"All the theatres of this size in North America are subsidized in some way," he said. "Stratford receives grants from the Canada Council and the province of Ontario. This past season, the Manitoba Theatre received \$45,000 from the city of Winnipeg and a Canada Council grant of \$95,000 in addition to a large subscription series."

"If there is to be a theatre here at all, it must be subsidized," he said. "I can't see any other way to keep one in operation."

Mr. Gray said he had no definite plans for the future, but he expects to follow his theatrical career in an area "other than the Maritimes."
