CLEVELAND, (AP) - Further signs of lessening demand for steel is reported in Steel Magazine's weekly summary of the metal-working industry.

On the whole, however, the magazine emphasizes, the demand remains strong. Evidence of a slack appear mainly in the warehouses. Steel said, pointing to these situations:

Boston warehouses are not placing orders to the full extent of their allotments on some items, including small cold-finished bars, strip, light plate and wire.

In the New York area, warehouses are taking in an increasing volume of steel, although not in sizes to balance inventories.

At St. Louis, warehouses inventories now are estimated at 60 per cent of capacity tonnage-wise and are the best rounded since the Second World War.

Sale Last Week Of 2200 Lb. Hereford

Vista Highland Girl, a 2200-lb. Hereford cow, was sold last week to Harper MacDonald of Covehead Road by Tom and Miller Sanderson of North River. The weight was believed by several veteran breeders to have been the heaviest for a cow in many years.

Vista Highland Girl is the dam of Highland Bruy Duo Tone Lass 25 D, the Grand Champion at the Maritime Winter Fair in 1950 and grand champion at Amherst in 1951. She also produced a grand champion steer at the Maritime Spring Show and Safe for the Sandersons a few years ago.

The eleven-year-old Hereford female was a grand daughter of Miss Coronet 85th, a perennial grand champion for the late E. H. Horne of Nova Scotia in her show days. The grand sire was Domino Heir Jr. The pair had been purchased for five thousand dollars each by Mr. Horne back in the thirties.

The sire of the big cow was Monte Vista Heir and the dam Highland Lady 2nd.

MOSCOW, (AP) - Seven visiting U. S. newspapers and radio executives were given official permission Wednesday to take photographs of anything they wish around Moscow with the exception of factories.

Most of the group have brought cameras and already are shooting pictures in perfect spring weather.

The Americans are led by James L. Wick of the Niles, Ohio, Daily Times. Two wives are with the group. Their arrival Tuesday night from Helsinki by plane was published in Pravda in the back page section customarily reserved for reports of arrivals of various delegations to the Soviet Union.

R. D. Armstrong, C. N. R.

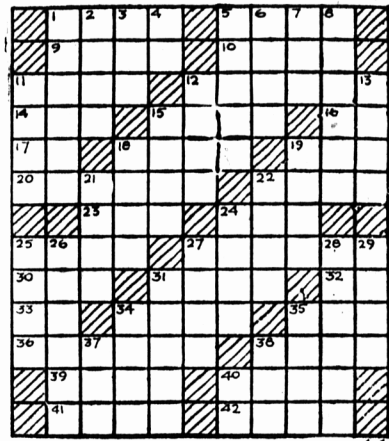
