Close Popular Vote Revealed By C.P. Figures

The Lord Privy Seal — last post held by the late Ernest Bevin — carries no departmental duties. He is available to undertake special assignments from the Prime Minister. In some cases that has been government leadership in the House of Lords. In Stokes' case, his major task will be to deal with raw materials, a problem which has assumed paramount importance in Britain.

TEHRAN, Iran, April 26 — (AP) — A special oil commission voted unanimously tonight to ask parliament to take immediate control of the big Anglo-Iranian Oil Company. The commission suggested that a 12-man board be set up to carry out the nationalization move.
