Making the most of his sharp iron shots and putting, Palmer scored a second round 67, five under the Weston club's par, to put himself in front at the half-way mark with 131.

Charles Sifford, U. S. Negro national champion who became a one-day wonder Wednesday with a tournament record 63 for the first round, soared to a 74 Thursday. He dropped well back into the 137 bracket, six strokes away from Palmer.

At 134 was Tommy Bolt of Chattanooga and Jerry Barber of Los Angeles, who scored a hole in one Wednesday and sank an eagle "three" Thursday.
