ITALIAN BACHELOR CLUB FAILS TO ATTRACT GIRLS

MONTALDEO, Italy (AP)—The women-starved bachelors of this tiny mountain village cooked an elaborate meal for the girls they hoped would answer their newspaper ads and come here to talk marriage. But by nightfall not a single girl had appeared.
All day long members of the Bachelors Club, wearing women's aprons and singing in happy anticipation, bustled about the large kitchen of the inn roasting chickens and turkeys and cooking spaghetti.
"What do you think?" they asked each other through the clouds of steam from the boiling pots. "Will the girls really come?"
Of the 400 residents of Montaldeo there are only 10 eligible girls for 110 bachelors. So the unmarried men placed newspaper ads inviting single girls from elsewhere to come to look them over, in a kind of marriage market.
"As night fell without the sight of a girl, Stefano Pastore, 33-year-old owner of the inn and a bachelor himself, sighed sadly and said: "I am afraid the guys will have to dance with them-

Revised U.S. Figures Given For Grain Crops During Year

WASHINGTON (AP)—The agriculture department, in its final survey of the year, has estimated this year's U. S. production of corn for grain at 4,193,225,000 bushels and of wheat at 1,210,542,000 bushels. The corn figure compares with last year's revised estimate of 4,094,942,000 bushels and with the 1966-67 average of 3,722,911,000 bushels. The wheat crop compares with last year's revised figure of 1,315,613,000 bushels and with the five-year average of 1,221,544,000 bushels. Both crops were grown under a department stabilization program offering payments to growers limiting their acreages. The department estimated this year's winter wheat crop at 1,056,821,000 bushels compared with 1,017,045,000 for last year's revised estimate and 992,835,000 for the five-year average. The production of durum wheat was put at 61,248,000 bushels compared with 60,000,000 last year and 49,167,000 for the average. **SPRING WHEAT DOWN** Production of spring wheat other than durum was estimated at 190,573,000 bushels compared with 228,662,000 last year and 183,902,000 for the average. The estimate for corn was 4,193,225,000 bushels last month; for all wheat 1,295,933,000; for durum wheat 61,248,000; and for spring wheat other than durum 192,894,000. The indicated 1966 production
