Don't say that they can't or won't do it. That is what is happening today with the students who are receiving bills for the non-occupancy of the other bed in their rooms! Do not feel secure because

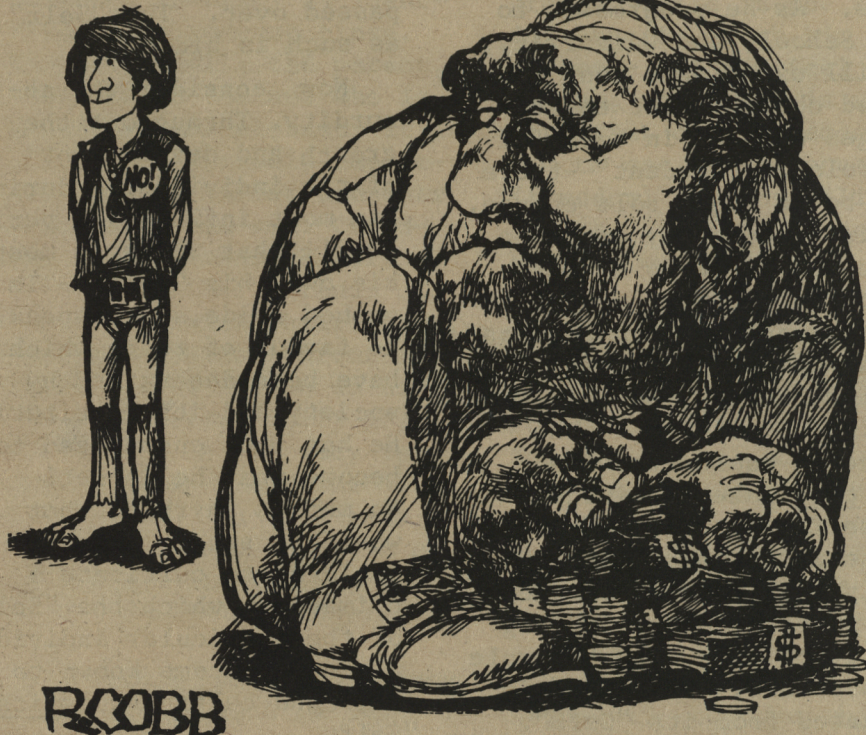
you may have something which resembles a Contract because the University can maneuver or manipulate the Fees and Regulations any time it wants. When I was discussing these things and disputing these matters

Yes, I suggest that you READ and PONDER that final, two line paragraph on page 41 of the 1972-73 Calendar. Now you will be able to see that you cannot trust any so-called Contract you may have because it can be declared null and void at the whim of the Administration.
