Canada And Italy Agree

Will Press For Increase In NATO Collaboration

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada and Italy agreed Monday to press for increased NATO co-operation in the non-military sphere at the May meeting of the North Atlantic Council.

The informal agreement resulted from talks between Prime Minister St. Laurent and External Affairs Minister Pearson and Italian President Giovanni Gronchi and Foreign Minister Gaetano Martino of Italy.

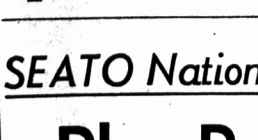

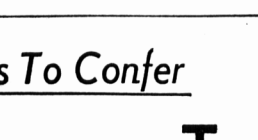

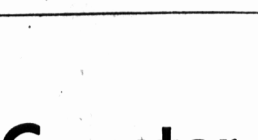

Quick Work Quells Fire In Newspaper Plant

MONTREAL (CP)—Quick-working firemen quelled a fire in the newspaper plant Monday.

The fire was confined to a ventilating shaft leading from the Montreal daily's newsroom.

It was believed the blaze was started by sparks shooting up the ventilator shaft from a fan.

The first alarm was sounded at 11:25 p.m. AST and within minutes all available firefighting equipment in the south end of the city was rushed to the building on St. James street in the financial district.

The blaze was brought under control in about 35 minutes.

No damage estimate was immediately available.
