Park Lifeguard Service Expected As Best Yet

When the P.E.I. National Park Lifeguard Service officially begins on Sunday, June 28, the park beaches will enter a summer of the best guard service they have ever had.

There will be two guards on duty seven days a week during the summer at Stanhope camping grounds and Cavendish main beach. Along with this service there will be a new station open at Rustico Island.

During the first two weeks of June the life guards were all attending a refresher course which aimed mainly at conditioning and learning new techniques. The course was run by the Red Cross organization, whose duty it is each year to qualify the guards.

Following the course the guards were kept busy putting their equipment in top shape for the season which has been predicted to be the biggest ever in terms of volume of people coming to the beaches.

This year 15 guards have a qualified and there are also two extra guards for use in emergency, the largest number of guards to qualify in one year.

Brackley Beach will be the scene on August 2 of the annual guards' demonstrations with the added attraction of help from the swimming and water safety instructors from the Red Cross, which should make the demonstration bigger and better than ever.
