# Define What Sandwich Is

MONTREAL (CP) — A special commission of the International Air Transport Association Wednesday announced an international, six-point program for keeping the simple sandwich simple, cold and inexpensive. The commission debated for two days in London to define the sandwich after IATA was asked to set a standard for the sandwich meals to be served aboard transatlantic economy class flights. Some lines had com-

plained as unfair competition in the type of sandwiches served. A sandwich, IATA says, must be, is, or may be:  
1. Cold;  
2. Open or closed;  
3. Made in large measure of bread, rolls or something like bread;  
4. Unadorned;  
5. Self-contained; (that is, it must not resemble a plate of cold cuts)  
6. Cheap.
