Sal Maglie Stars With No-Hit No-Run 5-0 Win

BROOKLYN (AP)—Sal Maglie, the old pappy guy, turned his already great command into an epic no-run performance over Philadelphia that gave Brooklyn a 5-0 victory and kept the Dodgers within a half game of first-place Milwaukee in the National League pennant race.
