Soviet Union Medical Care Discovered Not All Free

MOSCOW (AP) — Soviet authorities keep saying Soviet medical care is the world's best, and that it is free for everyone. The fact is that certain sectors of the Soviet medical program are not free.

Premier Khrushchev's new Communist party program, issued in 1961, said the party must provide — by 1963 — "free medical services for all citizens, including the supply of medicines and the treatment of patients at no cost."

To learn precisely what is free, and what is not free, an interview was conducted with top Soviet medical officials. Permission was granted for a visit to Moscow by Douglas Brian, chief of the Soviet Medical Services Board.
