OYSTER RESTRICTIONS.

SIR,—The announced closing of the oyster fishing until Oct 1st, will be a severe surprise to many poor fishermen. Whether this order is the result of a feeling against the "son of toil" or ignorance of conditions, is hard to decide. It is certainly not for the reason alleged, viz depletion of the beds. The lobster demanded protection when a decided falling off of export plainly indicated that consumption had largely overtaken production. The oyster catch—so far at least as concerns this province—shows the opposite conditions to prevail. Our export of oysters and home consumption also shows an increase annually. Last winter I urged upon our Minister, Sir Louis, some of the disadvantages under which our Island fishermen labored as compared with those of the other provinces. Those difficulties are now increased by this unwise and unnecessary restriction. The fisherman—who is also a farmer—could formerly earn a few dollars fishing oysters between grain harvest and potato digging. Fifteen days, or almost the whole of this time, is now taken from him by the prohibition. It is now difficult to find any privileges left. They care not fish in summer, nor through the ice in winter. Frost prevents both fishing and shipping in December and part of November. Want of communication with the outside world shuts off export, and consequently fishing in April and in May, between warm weather and markets already supplied by other Maritime fisheries, our product is practically shut out. This makes the plain English of the oyster regulations as applied to this province only. On Sundays you can't fish; and on week days we won't let you.

With all due deference to whatever opinion the Department of Fisheries may entertain, I have no hesitation in asserting that this last restriction is ill advised and uncalled for by the conditions of the fishing grounds adjacent to Charlottetown, and I believe also to the whole province; and I speak with some small knowledge of the subject, handling as I do, some thousands of barrels annually, by large odds the largest output from this port. As this subject is important, I will ask your permission to revert to some other features in another letter.

STING OF THE BEE

The chemical and toxic properties of the poison of the honeybee have been a subject for long study by a German scientist, Dr Joseph Zanger. During his investigation Dr. Zanger employed 25,000 bees. He found that the fresh poison is clear, like water, of an acid reaction, bitter taste and of a fine aromatic odor.

On evaporating and drying at a temperature of 100 degrees centigrade (212 degrees F.) a gummy residue is left. It is soluble in water; with alcohol it forms an emulsionlike mixture. The aromatic odor is due to a volatile substance, which disappears on evaporation and is not poisonous. The poisonous constituent is not destroyed by short boiling nor by drying and heating the residue to 212 degrees F. nor by the diluted acids or alkalis.

Dr. Zanger has proved the existence of formic acid, but he has also proved that that is not the poisonous principle. The latter is an organic base, soluble, with difficulty, in water, but kept in solution by an acid. On the healthy skin neither the bee poison nor a 2 per cent solution of the poisonous principle has any effect, but they act as powerful irritants on the mucous membranes.

His tests made on rabbits and other animals show that when the poison is brought in contact with the eye there follow lachrymation, hyperemia, chemosis and croupous membrane or conjunctiva. The general condition is also affected; the animals become melancholy, take no food, but are very thirsty, and the urine shows small amounts of albumen.—Philadelphia Record.

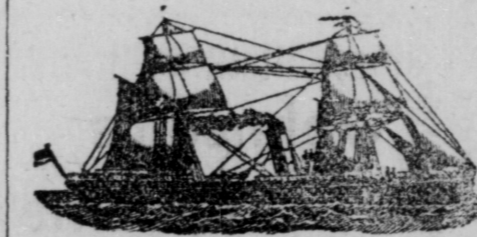

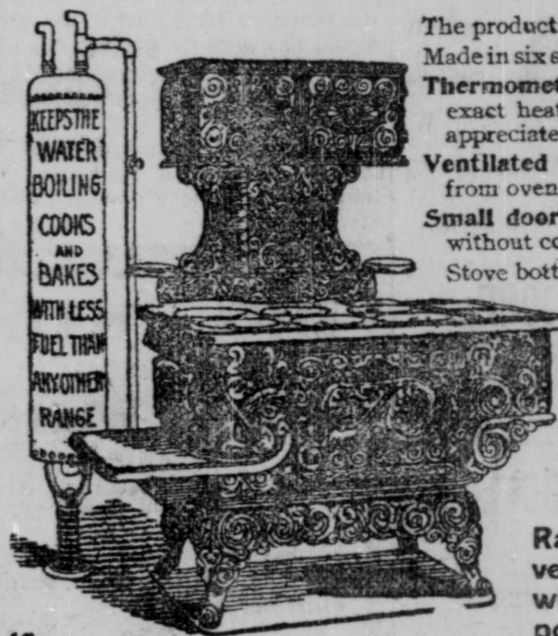
