Crooks Always Dream Of Way To Crack Brinks

CHICAGO (AP)—In the get-rich-quick-now dreams of the underworld, few jackpots rob more sleep than the gilded word "Brink's."

It is safe to say (because the president of Brink's himself says it) that there is always someone out there somewhere plotting darkly, thinking deeply, biting his nails and smoking far into the night to devise a way to crack Brink's and one of its homely little trucks with all that money inside.

"If crooks spent the energy legitimately that they do plotting against us, they'd all be corporation executives," said Brink's corporation president, A. S. Genet.

An elite few crack Brink's and gain riches. Others die trying because Brink's and its money are not easily parted. The rest just dream on, resigned to being not even an uninvited participant in a business that troubles \$300,000,000 about the country each year, a sum equal in value to half the total national income.

Brink's sees its mission in life as twofold—to make money for itself and to carry it for any one else. If you do business by cheque instead of cash, you can still do business with Brink's although the company good naturedly classes the cheque as the Hallowe'en mask. Brink's does a brisk trade carrying cheques between banks to be cancelled deposited, etc.

Brink's armored cars have also carried the Magna Carta, the original manuscript of the Gettysburg Address, a gold-plated hotwater heater, to a plumbing convention, and \$250,000 in silver dollars that a wax concern spread across the floor for its convention.

A Brink's truck waited patiently night after night in Kansas City with \$300 in silver dollars inside to present to Rocky Colavito when the Athletics' outfielder hit his 300th career homer. Rocky tried but No. 300 came, unfortunately, when he was on the road in Minneapolis.

St. Paul. Brink's has stood guard over ballot boxes in union elections and is forever delivering and protecting \$1,000,000 in cash that promotion-minded stores delight in displaying in their windows.

Brink's cashes and delivers payrolls, too, and collects parking meter coins for such cities as Rochester, N.Y., and Chicago where it has machines that sort the silver from the sordid to the tune of about 80 bags of slugs a day.

To do all this, Brink's 1,000 armored trucks make 40,000 pick-ups and deliveries across the United States every day handling an average of \$1,000,000,000. It's routine to carry \$750,000,000 in gold from, say, Denver to New York with a covey of guards riding escort station-wagons armed with the same type of Winchester rifles that real life Andy Devines used to clutch atop the stage coaches back in the bad old days.

That's how Brink's makes its money. How it keeps it is another story. The great Boston Brink's robbery that made the company a household word has long since been chalked up to experience—and profit. Brink's thinks the 1950 heist of \$2,300,000 helped business because the next day the company went around paying off, proving that if Brink's lost, at least its customers did not.

"We date everything from the last holdup around here," said Donald Hoagland, vice-president in charge of operations. That would be last Dec. 28 in Norridge, Ill., when a gang hit a truck for \$223,000, the fourth try for a score on Brink's in the last two years.

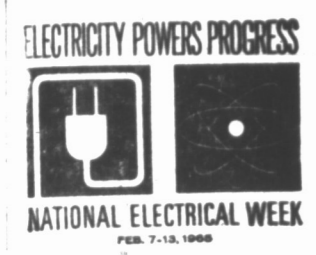
DIRTY WORD

Since "holdup" is a dirty word in the money business, it is apparently good. Brink'smanship not to mention it. Genet, a tall, husky man who is as trim as a crisp new dollar bill, rarely utters the word. He talks instead about an "unfortunate circumstance" or "a problem" or "one of these things."

"You have to learn to live with those things," he said. "But when the phone rings at home, you wonder 'oh God, what next? But usually it's just one of the children.'"

To stay one up on the hoods Brink's is always mulling over security procedures and the design of its trucks to try and discover any chinks in their armor. The company trained its own safecracker to test the safes it sells to customers. The safe man works under conditions any yegg would trade his blowtorch for—a sign on the door that says: "Private — safecracker at work."

A recent security improvement is an electric lock on the truck doors so they can be opened only from the sealed off driver's cab.
