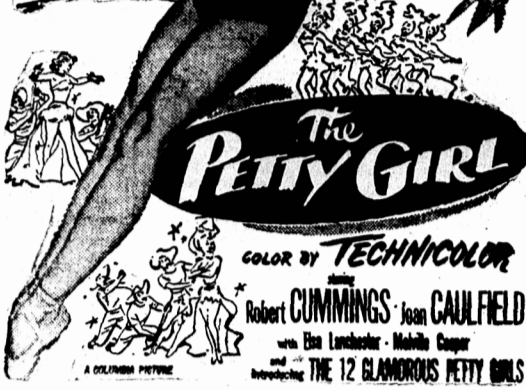

"DREDGE TO OPERATE AT LAUNCHING.—The Dominion Government Dredge No. 14, Captain Alex MacLean has arrived in Georgetown from Charlottetown. The Dredge was accompanied by the tug Glenlevit, Captain George Chapman of Murray Harbour. The 64 mile trip from Charlottetown to Georgetown was made with the Dredge fastened alongside the tug. Instead of the usual tow line method. On Monday the Dredge proceeded to Launching Pond, where she will be engaged in digging for the summer. Mr. Lemuel MacCormick of Georgetown is a crew member of No. 14. The tug Glenlevit, on completion of the tow to Launching, will proceed to Montague to attend Dredge No. 115.

Death On Sunday Of Mr. C. H. MacQuarrie

The death of Mr. Charles H. MacQuarrie, age 67 years, occurred suddenly at the King's County Hospital after a long illness, on Sunday morning.

The late Mr. MacQuarrie was born at Roseneath, the son of the late Daniel MacQuarrie and Mrs. MacQuarrie, who is at present living with her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. A. M. Wright.

Mr. MacQuarrie was a well-known and respected farmer, and had spent his whole life at Roseneath.

He married the former Hazel Gordon, who survives him. Also surviving are his mother, two sisters, Mrs. A. M. Wright (Florence), Montague; Miss Ethel MacQuarrie, Montague; two brothers, Willard, Sask., and Lloyd in Alberta; two daughters, Marion (Mrs. Warren Trotter) of Kingston, Ont., and Jean of Toronto, and two sons, Donald at home, and Malcolm, third year student of Prince of Wales College.

The funeral service will be held from his residence today at 2 p.m. Interment will be in the Montague Community Cemetery.

Will Seek Paving Of Street In Souris

The Souris Board of Trade will soon be making representations to the Provincial Government, that the breakwater street leading to the Souris railway wharf be paved. This short stretch of road, about one-half mile long, is important to the many potato growers in King's County. It is used far more by rural people, than by the residents of the Town. This fact will be pointed out by the Souris Board of Trade, according to the secretary, Mr. Charles Boylan.

As an illustration to prove that the street should be given a permanent covering, Mr. Boylan cited an incident which occurred during the past season. A potato boat was being loaded at the railway wharf. The street in question became impassable—trucks could not negotiate the half mile from the main street of Souris to the wharf. In the emergency, potatoes were unloaded into railroad cars, where the railroad crosses the main street in the eastern end of Souris, and hauled the short half mile to the boat. Thus, double work and increased expense was piled on the growers at a time when potatoes were at a very low price.
