

Riot's Cause Investigated

KINGSTON, Ont. (CP)—Investigators continued checking today to find out why 60 apparently contented men went on a devastating rampage Sunday at nearby Collins Bay Penitentiary.

G. L. Sauvart, senior commissioner of the penitentiaries branch of the justice department, was to arrive to lead an official investigation.

Warden Victor Richmond and representatives of the Ontario fire marshal's office conducted a preliminary investigation Monday.

GAME RAINED OUT
Justice Minister Fulton said in the Commons Monday damage had been set at \$82,500. The riot broke out when the 450 prisoners were filling indoors from a rained-out baseball game.

One official said he couldn't understand why the men would want to destroy their dormitories, canteen and much of their own possessions. Hobbycraft kits, reference books and other things carefully collected by the men were put to the torch.

TAKE PRECAUTIONS

Warden Victor Richmond said: "The insurrection took place and I see no way of avoiding them. As long as penitentiaries exist you will get a certain amount of unrest and can only take precautions against it."

About 100 of the prisoners were moved to temporary quarters in the hallways of the cellblocks because of damage to dormitories.

The penitentiary is not considered a maximum security prison. It is largely a rehabilitation centre where trades are taught and the men work profitably in the fields and shops.

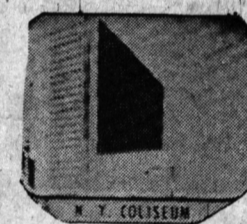
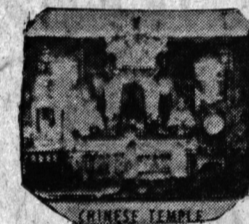
