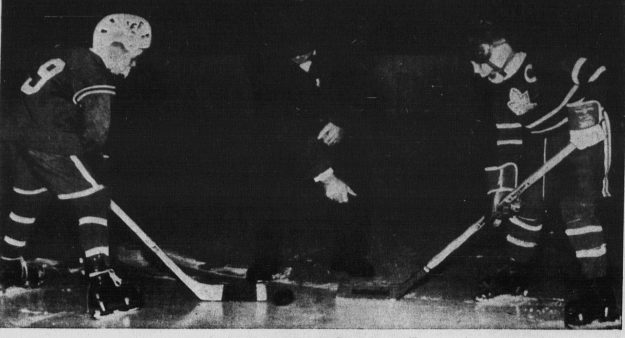

This nine-year-old boy moved shyly to towering Leaf left-winger Frank Mahovlich, the Big M, as he is called by his mates and newspaper men, handed his stick to him. The boy beamed a smile that only an awe-struck young star can emit.

The boy then hesitatingly moved to all the players, getting them to sign their autographs on the stick. Many of the players seemingly snapped out of their after-game blues to give the kid a sincere smile.

When he had all the autographs, the boy stood at the door of the dressing room, said it was the greatest thing that ever happened to him, and thanked the man who brought him into the room.
